



## PUPIL PREMIUM PASSPORT

### Stationery

All children receive their own stationery at the beginning of the year. Children can develop a sense of ownership and responsibility.

Items are replenished throughout the year as necessary.

### Quality- First Teaching

All children receive the highest quality teaching through experienced teachers who adapt teaching to pupils' individual learning styles .

Impact: There are high aspirations for the children will teaching following a cycle of planning, assessment and review.

## Academic

### Pupil Progress Reviews

Termly discussions take place with the senior leadership team , teachers and support staff regarding pupils' individual progress. Tailored support strategies are put in place to help support each child make accelerated progress and to enable them to reach their full potential.

### Reading

The school places high emphasis on reading as soon as a child starts in Early Years and we promote reading for pleasure. We have targeting tutoring groups and use reading volunteers from to help support the children in their reading journey.

### Interventions

We have a wide range of tailored interventions for children that need additional support. These are made up of small groups and 1-1 interventions in specific subject areas and take place during the school day.

We have 1-1 tutoring for phonics which takes place during the day and after school as well as maths interventions.



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### Outside speakers

We arrange regular outside speakers into school to enhance our curriculum offer and inspire the children.

### Educational Visits and Experiences

We have a wide range of educational visits across all year groups which are free for pupil premium children. We also have a residential trip in Norfolk for Year 6 pupils. This is subsidised for children eligible for Pupil Premium.

## Enrichment & Engagement

### Cultural Capital

We endeavour to provide children with a rich range of experiences to help them understand the world and become confident in their own knowledge and skills. This takes the form of enrichment opportunities with a cultural focus such as visits to libraries and theatres and museums. Within school, we provide them with the opportunities that enrich their learning beyond the classroom and heighten global awareness.

### School Clubs & External Organisations

We have a wide variety of school clubs each day for all age ranges, including crafts, music and sports. For all of the above, children eligible for Pupil Premium receive these free of charge or at a discounted rate.



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### ELSA

We have ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) staff who are specially trained teaching assistants who provide targeted, evidence-based, short-term support for children and young people experiencing social, emotional, or mental health difficulties.

### Kids Inspire

Children who are in need of additional mental health and wellbeing support can be referred to Kids Inspire. This is run by a trained member of staff who works with children weekly, both running projects and providing children with a safe space to talk and share thoughts and feelings.

## Wellbeing

### Pupil and Family Welfare Leader

We have a Pupil and Family Welfare Leader( Miss Ola) who focuses on improving attendance, behaviour, and emotional wellbeing by providing targeted support to pupils and their families. She works to remove barriers to learning, liaise with outside agencies to ensures child safety.

### Community Support & Events

At Hillside we celebrate the community engagement that brings support to our school. We hold a number of events such as Summer Fair, International Food Fair, and host Pop-Up café after school weekly.

Children are involved in the planning and preparation of many events and we have a number of important committees within school, such as the school council and Eco-Committee. Our children know the school is supported by the wider community which goes a long way to creating a sense of belonging and purpose.

Children eligible for Pupil Premium are prioritised for involvement in school events and their engagement is not only recognised but celebrated.

### Clothing & Food Support

We work with local charities who can provide additional support for our most vulnerable families. The school will help by assisting with referrals and applications, working with charities and by passing on donations of food and winter clothing. Owe pledge that most vulnerable children will not go hungry and offer free breakfast bagels every morning to all our pupils. We also offer free breakfast club provision for Pupil Premium children.
