

The five steps to HNC



Step 1: Research

Doing your research is really important, particularly when choosing your courses. We recommend:

- Visiting our virtual Open Event platform to explore why HNC could be the College for you. Remember, you can watch some taster lesson videos
- Attending one of our face to face Open Events to meet our outstanding staff and students, and get a feel for life on Campus
- At this early stage, you should carefully research where your preferred courses may lead you after HNC. You should also take a look at the entry criteria for these courses

Step 2: Apply

- If you attend a partner school in Kirklees (usually any school without a dedicated Sixth Form) you will apply via the centralised portal. Your school will direct this process
- If you attend a non partner school or a school outside Kirklees then you will need to apply online at www.huddnewcoll.ac.uk
- It is really important to apply by the deadline of **17**th **February 2022**. As an oversubscribed College, we are unable to invite late applicants to interview

Step 3: Get ready

- Your admissions interview will take place between January March 2022
- Your admissions interview is a real chance to discuss your ambitions for the future, and ensure your chosen courses will support these
- If by this stage you're still unsure about your course choices or want an opportunity to confirm these are the right ones for you, then we highly recommend you book on to our Subject Tasters on 8th February 2022. See page 2 for details

Step 4: Accept your place and explore

- If you are successful in your College interview you will receive a conditional offer this effectively means that if you meet the entry criteria for your courses, you will be able to enrol in August
- You must accept your place by 8th April 2022. Places not accepted by the deadline are withdrawn, and cannot be reinstated
- Remember, you are free to accept places at more than one College. This is highly recommended, if you need more time to decide on your choice of College
- Accepted applicants will receive a log in to our online College, HNC@Home. This is your online College, and is designed to give you a head start on your studies at HNC

Step 5: Say hello

- All accepted students are invited to our special orientation Welcome Event in July. This is chance to ask any final questions and explore the Campus
- Post GCSE Results Day you will attend your enrolment appointment
- Then we'll say hello to you as a new member of our College community!



Subject choice is a core part of your journey to HNC. We offer an exceptional range of courses where if you choose to you can study A Levels, BTECs or a combination of both

Choosing your courses is a big decision, and we know that getting this right is crucial. Selecting your courses will involve a range of factors, but ultimately your study programme needs to support your progression from College to university, a job or an apprenticeship. Where you are still unsure of what your next step will be, it is important to select a study programme that offers you flexibility. The detailed information about each of our courses will help you to decide if it is the right course for you.

Remember, when choosing your courses, it is important to look at their specific entry criteria, and ensure that your predicted GCSE grades will support your entry to these courses.

- there are lots of ways in which we'll support you to make the best courses choices for you and your future ambitions, and there is plenty of help, support and advice available.

We know that course choice is a big decision, but please don't panic

Before you start

The very first step when choosing your courses is to think about what you might want to do when you leave College. Do the courses support what I want

to do? If you want to go to unviersity, some university courses will require you to have studied certain courses. It is worth taking a look at a few universities. If you are not sure what you want to do, then it is important to choose subjects which offer flexibility. Every one of our courses share a few examples of where it could lead to in the future

Do I enjoy the subject matter?

You'll spend a significant amount of time studying it, so you should have a genuine passion for the courses chosen. Remember, if a university asks you to have studied a course, this is likely because it will feature heavily in the degree you have selected

Am I being open minded? We

offer a number of fantastic courses that you might not have studied at GCSE, but which are valued highly by universities. Whilst it's great to have a vision for your future, it is also important to be open to new possibilities too

Do I meet the entry criteria? We

will only offer places on courses where your GCSE predicted grades demonstrate that you will achieve the entry criteria. If yours don't, then it is important to look at alternatives

Building your Level 3 study programme: As easy as 1, 2, 3!

There is a comprehensive choice at HNC.

We offer A Levels, and a range of BTECs which are available as 1, 2 or 3 A Level equivalents.

The key is to remember that your study programme should always total 3 A Levels/A Level equivalents. The table below explains more:

What if I want to study a 4th A Level/A Level equivalent?

A fourth A Level (or equivalent) may be available to students on our Aspire XL programme. To access this, you will need to be on track to achieve an average GCSE point score of 6.4 or higher. See page 36 for details.

What if I want to study three singular **BTEC Extended Certificates?**

Whilst this may be possible, if you want to study three singular BTECs we strongly recommend that you consider a BTEC Extended Diploma due to the workload involved. If you believe such a programme is the one for you, this would need to be discussed at interview.

Understanding the Entry Criteria

It is important to look at the entry criteria for your chosen courses. For access to any course, you must meet the College's general entry requirements, along with any subject specific criteria. The information below provides a quick summary. please visit the individual course information listing on our website for full details.

Please note that during your interview, part of the process will be to review your reference from school. This reference will give us an indication of the grades you are likely to achieve at the end of your GCSEs. We therefore strongly recommend that you make yourself aware of our entry criteria, and that of individual courses too, as we cannot offer places on courses where expected grades are lower than this. If this is the case for you, your interviewer will discuss alternatives with you. TOP TIP Remember that the College's general - Plus you must meet any subject entry criteria demonstrate the

minimum that you are expected to achieve. A number of courses have subject entry criteria attached too. These are all listed alongside each course listing on our website

If you want to study one or more A Levels

Then as a minimum you will need: - 2 GCSEs at grade 5 and 3 GCSEs at grade 4

- One of the grade 5s must be in either GCSE English Language or Literature, but the GCSE English Language grade cannot be lower than a grade 4
- GCSE Maths must be achieved at grade 4 or above
- The grades 4 or above in the other GCSE subjects need to be in academic GCSE subjects and should relate to your chosen courses
- For a study programme including a 4th Level 3 qualification, you are required to achieve 5 GCSEs at grades 7 to 9 and at least a grade 6 in both GCSE English Language and GCSE Maths. Your GCSE average point score should be above 6.4

specific entry criteria

If you want to study a full Level 3 BTEC programme


Then as a minimum you will need: - 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including GCSE English Language

- GCSE Maths at grade 3 or above (if grade 4 or above, will be included as one of the five GCSEs needed)
- One vocational equivalent qualification at Pass grade or above can be substituted for one GCSE grade (excluding GCSE English Language and GCSE Maths)
- Plus subject specific entry criteria

What happens if I don't meet either the A Level or the BTEC Level 3 minimum entry criteria?

Then you may be able to apply for one of our Level 2 BTEC programmes. These are one year programmes that will provide access to Level 3. To access the Level 2 BTEC programme you will need:

- Grade 3 in GCSE English Language and grade 2 in GCSE Maths
- Plus 1 GCSE or vocational equivalent at grade 4
- Plus 1 GCSE at grade 3 and 1 GCSE at grade 2
- Plus you must meet any subject specific entry criteria

Financial Help

If you need help with meeting the costs associated with College, we offer both Free School Meals and a 16-19 Bursary scheme (eligibility criteria applies). This may include a catering allowance which operates as a daily allowance which can be spent in our onsite catering provision. The Bursary scheme offers support with costs such as travel. We also have a Hardship Fund. Full information regarding all of these schemes is made available ahead of enrolment.







