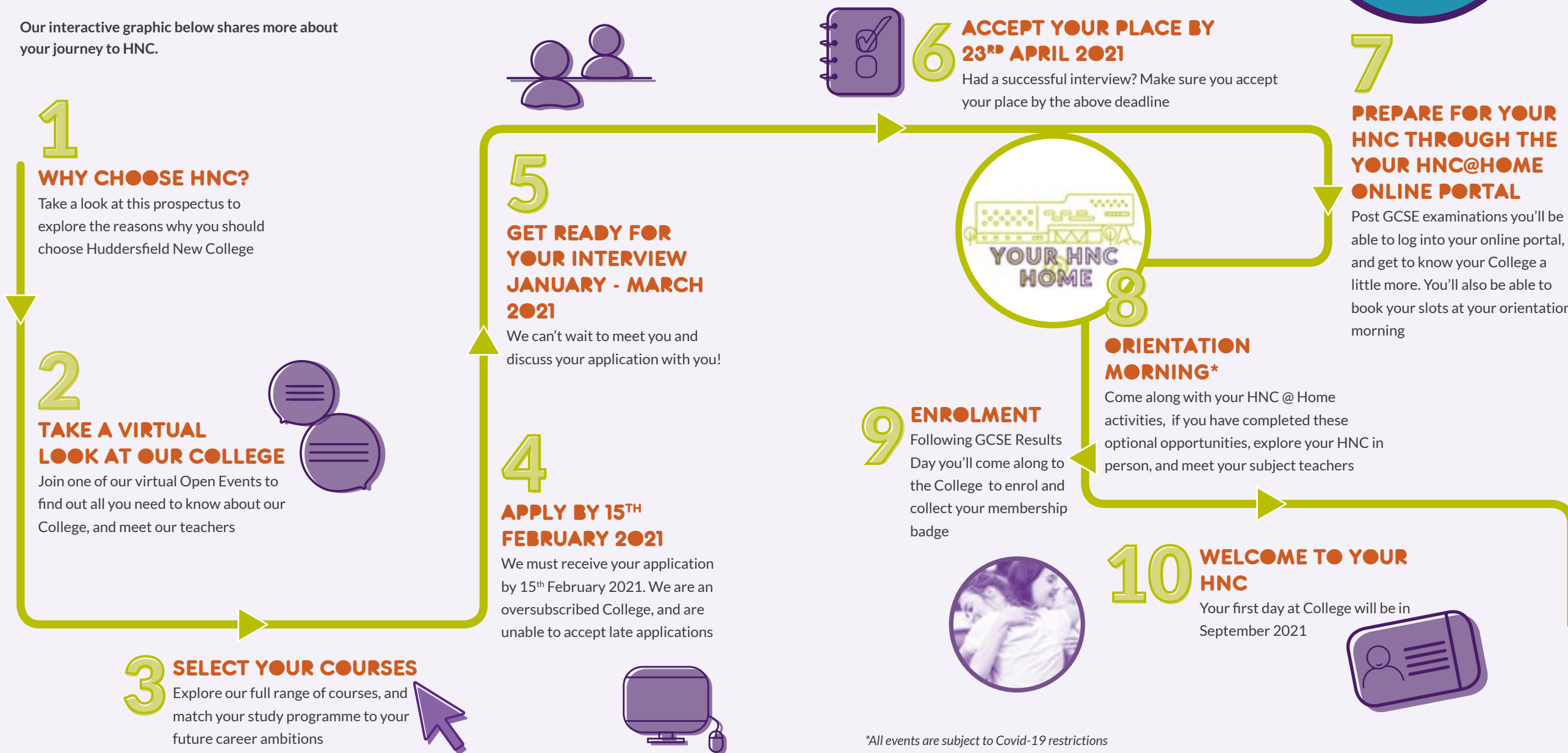

Think about what you enjoy and what you are good at

Consider your future career ambitions and what any courses you may need to study in order to pursue this career ambition

Take a look at the entry criteria for your preferred courses and make sure your predicted grades match this

Remember, there are subjects you may not have studied before at GCSE, such as Law, Psychology and Film Studies. It is also not always necessary to have studied a subject at GCSE to access it at A Level, for example A Level History. We recommend lots of research into unfamiliar subjects at A Level

Finally, don't panic. If you are unsure about your final course choices, a large part of our interview process focuses on helping you to finalise these and your future career ambitions

A PROGRAMME AS UNIQUE AS YOU AND YOUR AMBITIONS!

A programme as unique as you and your ambitions!

Our wide ranging curriculum gives you a unique range of options for your study programme courses. A full time Level 3 study programme will always total three A Levels (or vocational equivalent).

Each A Level counts as one of your three choices, as these are singular qualifications. A number of our BTEC qualifications are available as 1, 2 and 3 A Level equivalents. The blocks below illustrate how you could combine qualifications to create your bespoke 3 A Level study programme!

If you don't meet the entry criteria for a Level 3 study programme, you may

qualify to apply for a one year Level 2 study programme first. Most of our Level 2 students progress to a Level 3 study programme at the College at the end of their Level 2 study programme.

Please note you should choose no more than two predominantly practical/coursework based A Levels. If you want to combine three practical/coursework based A Levels, you should seriously consider an Extended Diploma course

A Level + **A Level** + **A Level** = **3 subjects**

A Level + **A Level** + **BTEC Level 3 Extended Certificate (1 A Level equivalent)** = **3 subjects**

A Level + **BTEC Level 3 Diploma (2 A Level equivalent)** = **3 subjects**

BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma (3 A Level equivalent) = **3 subjects**

A quick look at entry criteria

Your entry criteria may be different from the general entry criteria depending on the courses you wish to study. Some courses have additional criteria attached to ensure your success on the course. A summary of general entry criteria can be found in the table below. Our full entry criteria can be found by clicking [here](#).

If you are looking to study an A Level as a minimum you will need to achieve:

- 2 GCSEs at grade 5 and 3 GCSEs at grade 4 minimum
- One of the grade 5s must be in either GCSE English Language or Literature, but the GCSE English Language grade should not be lower than a grade 4
- GCSE Maths must be achieved at grade 4 or above. The grades 4 or above in the other GCSEs need to be in academic GCSE subjects and should relate to your chosen A Level or combination programme
- For a study programme including a 4th Level 3 qualification, you are required to achieve 5 GCSEs at grades 7 to 9 and at least a grade 6 in both GCSE English Language and GCSE Maths. Your GCSE average point score should be above 6.4
- Plus subject specific entry criteria

If you are looking to study a Level 3 vocational programme, as a minimum you will need to achieve:

- 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English Language
- GCSE Maths at grade 3 or above (if grade 4 or above, will be included as one of the five GCSEs needed)
- One vocational equivalent qualification at Pass grade or above can be substituted for one GCSE grade (excluding English Language and Maths) at grade 4 or above
- Plus subject specific entry criteria

If you do not expect to meet the Level 3 entry criteria, you may be able to apply for one of our Level 2 programmes.

You will need to achieve:

- GCSE grade 3 in English Language and grade 2 in Maths
- Plus 1 GCSE or vocational equivalent at grade 4
- Plus 1 GCSE at grade 3 and 1 GCSE at grade 2
- Plus subject specific entry criteria

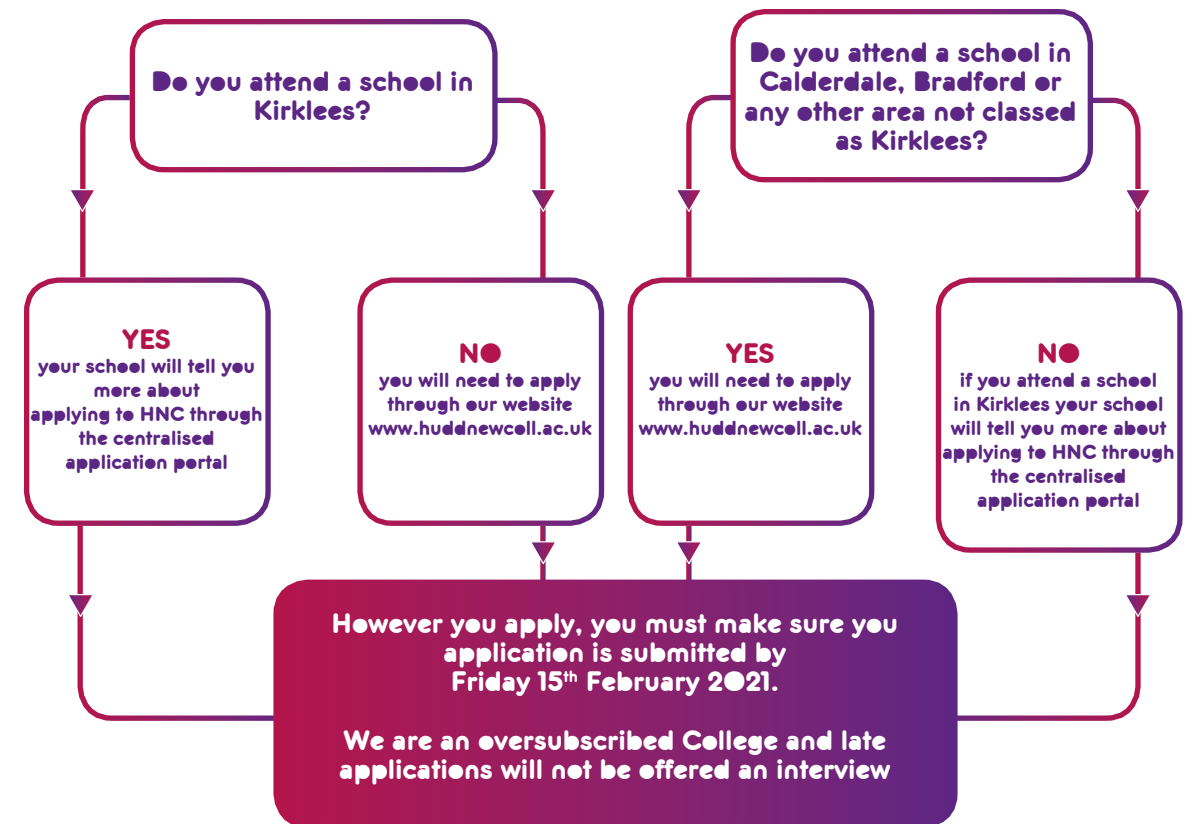

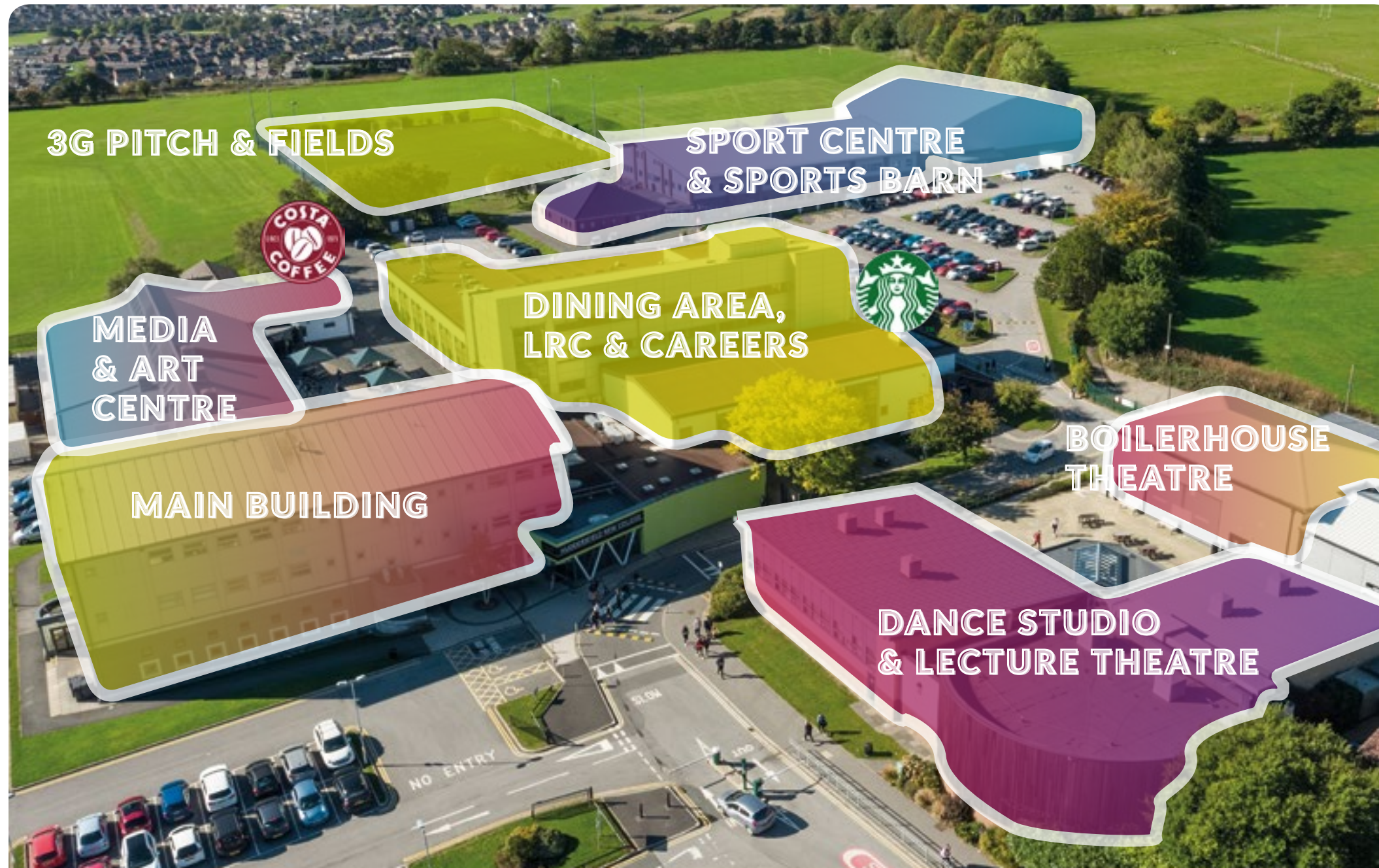

Your HNC @ Home

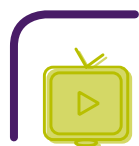

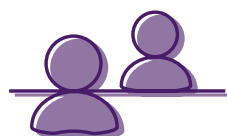

Your Progress Tutors

As a student, you will be assigned a Progress Tutor who will support you every step of the way in your HNC journey, including:

- Monitoring your attendance and punctuality, and supporting you, if there are issues affecting your progress
- One to one monitoring meetings, to ensure you stay on track, make progress and achieve your Estimated Final Grades (EFG)
- Weekly tutorials to support your personal development
- Support with university, apprenticeship or job applications during your final year

You will meet your Progress Tutor on at least a weekly basis, and they also provide a key link between College and home.

Car/Moped

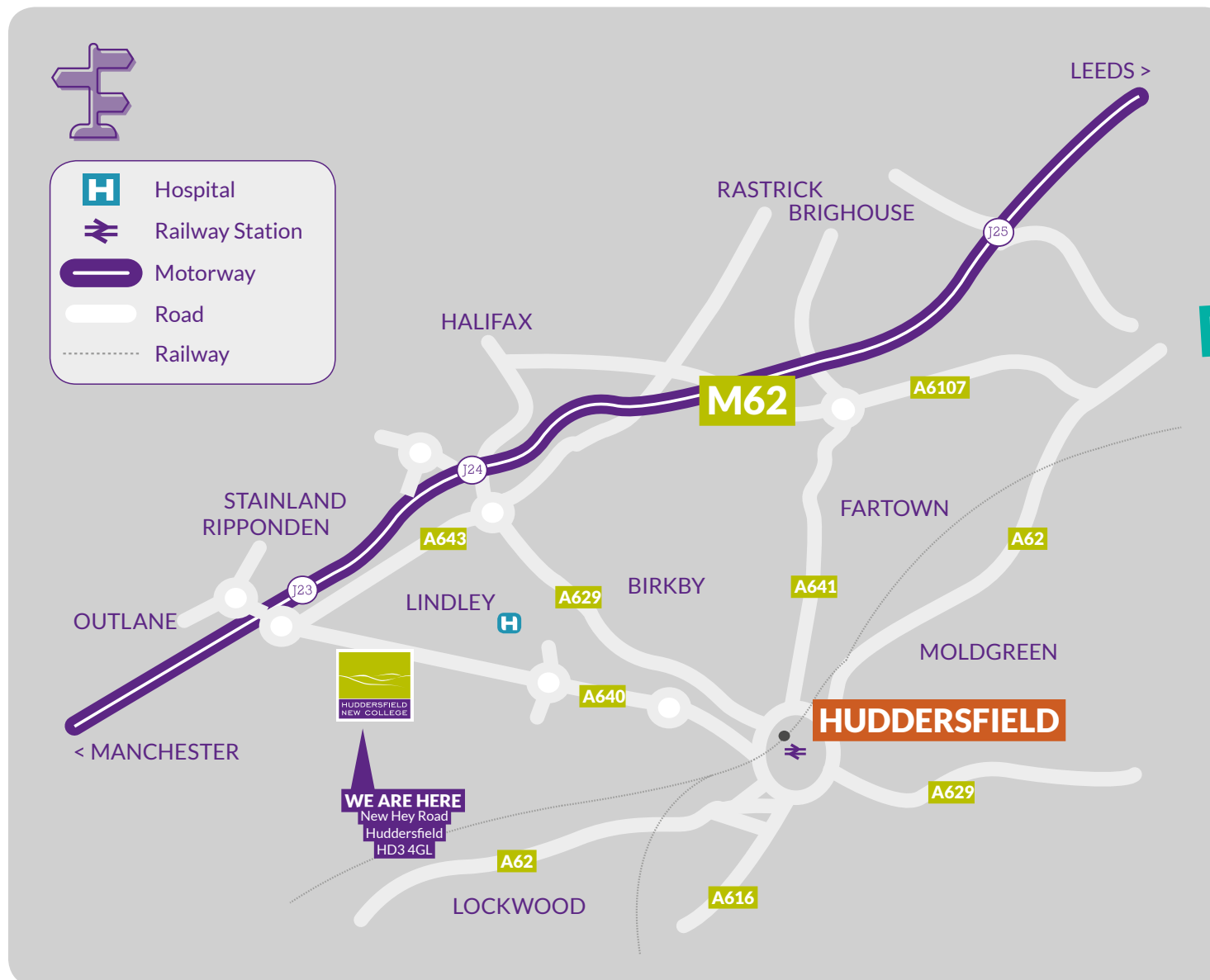
Parking (with a permit) is available onsite
