Thought for the Week – Symbolism - "Symbols are the imaginative signposts of life." Margot Asquith (d.1945). This week pupils have been considering 'symbolism', Something that represents or stands for an idea, object or relationship. Symbols help us to communicate and express our thoughts, ideas and beliefs. This week, Hindus around the world celebrate the Hindu story, Ramayana, in the festival Navratri. Navratri (nine nights) celebrates the victory of hero, Rama, over the evil 10 headed Ravana. This festival contains lots of symbolism including the victory of good over evil. Did you know that each of Ravana's 10 heads symbolise a different negative human emotion; lust, anger, delusion, greed, pride, jealousy, selfishness, hatred. cruelty and vanity. Please encourage your daughter to think of other symbolism in our society over the weekend.

**Wear it Pink Collection** – We are currently collecting pink items to create hampers filled with pink goodies and treats ready for our October fundraising event, Wear it Pink for Cancer Research. We welcome donations of any new pink products to support this worthy cause, e.g. socks, make up, hair accessories, stationery, toiletries etc. Pupils should bring any donations by Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October.

Coats and Shoes - Parents are requested to ensure that pupils bring a waterproof coat and wear plain black, practical sturdy shoes to school. This is especially important during the colder and damper days of late Autumn and Winter.

**Leave in Term Time** - The Local authority has recently prosecuted families of pupils who have not attended school. It is imperative that pupils regularly attend school and receive their full-time education. Absence from school can affect their attendance, learning and relationships with staff and their peers. Pupils may also find difficulty reintegrating back into school.

ParentPay – We're really pleased to see that the majority of our parents have activated their ParentPay accounts, and are using ParentPay to regularly top-up their daughters' balance for lunch payments. A really useful feature in ParentPay is the ability for parents to set a "communication alert" so that they automatically receive an email when their daughter's lunch balance falls below a certain amount. To learn how to set up communication alerts, simply google "parentpay set up email alerts", and check your Spam/Junk Mail folders,

as genuine ParentPay emails can get incorrectly filtered. Please note that the email balance alert option is free-of-charge, whereas the sms-text balance alert option is chargeable to the parent's ParentPay account.



**Collecting your Daughter** – It is lovely to see parents waiting for their children at the end of the school day. To support the school in ensuring members of the public can still access the foot path could we kindly ask parents to wait on the opposite side of the road, or further down the road. The community police officer has also asked the school to remind parents not to park on the zigzag marking outside schools.

Out of Hours Learning – Pupils are being informed of all appropriate out of hours learning opportunities and provided with the appropriate consent forms by their teachers. Please ensure that consent forms are returned to school as soon as possible. Pupils should post their completed consent forms in the pupil post box on the ground floor. After-School Homework Club – The After-School Homework Club starts on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> of September. This provides a quiet environment with computer facilities for pupils to complete their homework from Monday to Thursday each week. If a pupil wants to join our Homework Club, they must collect and return the appropriate consent form.

Year 11 Mock Exams – "The best preparation for tomorrow is doing your best today." H. Jackson Brown. With the Year 11 mock examinations in 5 weeks' time; it is important that our pupils are preparing for these exams. All Year 11 pupils participated in revision workshops on their first day of term to help provide them with more ideas to support their exam preparation. In addition, there are a variety of tools that support revision and preparation for examinations including GCSE Pod, Tassomai, Hegarty Maths, BBC Bitesize, textbooks, personal notes etc.

Maths - Maths is all around us - you can use everyday experiences to reinforce and develop maths skills and vocabulary. Measurement, fractions, shapes, time and money all benefit from real world application and often can be naturally harnessed as a way to learn maths. When out shopping there are many opportunities to practice maths from counting out items, comparing discounts and special offers, to managing money and calculating the change. Encourage and talk to your daughter about the mathematics of shopping

**The Young Walter Scott Prize 2019 Competition** – Pupils that are fascinated by History and love writing fiction are invited to enter this competition. The challenge is to write between 800 and 2000 words that is set in a time before you were born. Any kind of fiction is accepted – prose, poetry, drama, fictional letters or reportage. **The Education Art Prize 2019 Competition** – Following on from our success in this competition last year, pupils are invited to enter this competition organised by Specialist Crafts Art and Design. To enter, pupils need to design and develop a clay item with the potential to be commercially scalable. The closing date is 30<sup>th</sup> November. Year 11 Art, Craft & Design After School Club - Started on 17th September and will be running each week on a Tuesday until Christmas to support the additional time and resources required to complete the exam board's

assessment objectives thoroughly for Component 1. Please encourage your daughter to attend as Component 1 is worth 60% of her final GCSE grade.

**The Big Draw** – This is the world's largest drawing festival, which celebrates the importance of drawing in all its forms during October every year. This year the theme is "Drawn to Life" focusing on the many ways creativity enhances wellbeing. Pupils are encouraged to try something creative to lift their mood or just to have a go and learn or try a new skill. More information is available on this link.

Art - There has been a great start to the year in the Art Department with changes to our programme of study. Pupils are reminded to use the Art Department site on the Pupil Portal to highlight the areas they will be studying this year, to keep up to date with news and read the additional learning resources available to help improve skills. GCSE Pod – During last week 449 pods were watched, with History, Spanish and English Literature the most accessed subjects. 72% of our pupils now have active GCSE Pod accounts. If your daughter has not activated her account, please encourage her to use the link on the school website or pupil portal to activate her account.

There is also lots of useful advice for parents to help support their daughter with her use of GCSE pod and also the development of good study skills in the GCSE Pod Parents section.

Hegarty Maths – This is an online resource used by the Maths Faculty as part of its homework setting programme. Each week your daughter will be guided towards certain "clips" and work for her to complete. However, Hegarty Maths is not restricted to the teacher set homework. Hegarty Maths can be searched for video/animated clips on virtually all the topics within the GCSE maths course. Pupils can watch the clips and learn how to tackle the topic with step by step instructions. They can then practice what they have learnt with a short test that will rate their competence on that topic. The target for success is 80% +. Parents are recommended to take a look at their daughter's tests/classwork books and encourage them to search Hegarty Maths for any topic that they are struggling with?

To access the Hegarty Maths pupils need enter their name, date of birth, our school name and then set their own passwords. Any pupils who have forgotten their passwords can ask their maths teacher to reset it.

**Tassomai** –The Science Faculty are using the Tassomai software programme as homework for all pupils this year. This is an app that generates exam questions tailored to the pupil's individual needs and to support her learning. Please ensure your daughter has registered her account and is completing tasks daily.

The app can be downloaded onto a smart phone, tablet or computer. Full instructions for pupils are available on the Pupil Portal, which pupils can easily log into by using the Office 365 link at the top of our school website. We urge you to monitor their usage regularly to support better progress in Science. You daughter can speak to her Science teacher or Dr Malik if there are any problems.
