Our Curriculum Evening is a fantastic opportunity for parents to gain an insight into the curriculum taught at Hodge Hill Girls' School. There will be presentations, displays of pupil work and the opportunity to meet staff and ask questions. **Year 10 trip to see An Inspector Calls** – On Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> October, 48 Year 10 pupils are going on a trip to see An Inspector Calls. This is an excellent opportunity for our pupils to develop their understanding of the play, which they study for their English Literature GCSE.

All pupils going on the trip must wear full school uniform, no trainers or plimsoles. Pupils are required to bring a healthy packed lunch/snacks with a drink. All pupils on free school meals will be provided with a packed lunch. The trip will be leaving school at 11:00am and is expected to return at 5:45pm, dependant on traffic.

Wear it Pink for Breast Cancer – On Friday 19<sup>th</sup> October, pupils can wear something pink with their normal uniform to support the Wear it Pink for Breast Cancer day. Donations of £1 will be collected on the day.

We would be grateful for donations of any PINK items to be used as prizes for our forthcoming raffle in support of Breast Cancer. Donations should be brought into school by Friday 19<sup>th</sup> October.

Black History Month - During Black History Month we are reflecting on achievements and excellence as we learn about people who overcame barriers to be the first in their field. Aiming high our pupils are thinking about what they want to achieve and be first at. Please encourage your daughter to think and talk about what she wants to achieve and what she can be 'first' at. Mock Examinations (Year 10 and Year 11) – It is never too early to start preparing for examinations. Many of our pupils are using the revision techniques they learnt in the workshops at the beginning of this term. As parents please continue to discuss the importance of revision with your daughter. It is important for your daughter to be organised and ensure that she seeks help now if there is anything that she does not understand. There is lots of support available within school, includes a variety of afterschool clubs, GCSE Pod and revision guides.

Please ask your daughter how many GCSE PODs she has watched as part of her revision. The popularity of GCSE POD is growing with over 1500 GCSE Pods watched by our pupils during September. Pupils find the short videos in GCSE Pod an excellent way to support their learning and revision.

After-school Clubs - A reminder to parents that if you have signed the consent form to say you will be collecting your daughter from an after-school club, you must come down the driveway and into Reception. This enables us to ensure that your daughter is supervised before collection.

This is an excellent opportunity for pupils in all years to have a quiet place to complete homework and use computers to support their learning.
