## Sharing a story

#### Things to do:

Talk about the author

Talk about the front cover

Talk about the back cover

What do they think the story is going to be about?

### While reading:

While reading the story you could stop and ask questions about the story to check that your child is understanding what is happening.

What do you think will happen next? Why? Were you right? You could also ask them phonic questions,

What sound is this, do you know this word, what word do these sounds make?

#### At the end:

After finishing reading the story you could ask your child to tell you about what happened in the story.

You could also ask them to find the page where something happened.

What was their favourite part of the story and why?

#### Reading books with no words:

If we are sending home books that do not have words in, this is because your child is not ready to begin reading words from a page.

The books will still tell a story through the pictures. We would like you to go through each page asking your child to describe what is happening in the pictures. They are then free to follow the story or make their own.

You could ask your child to sound out the words for the pictures, or say the initial sound of the things in the picture.

## Bug Club

Bug club is an online library which I can control.

I have access to your childs account, so I can allow them access to books that are suitable for their reading level.

Your child can log on as many times as they would like and read the stories as many times as they would like. There are also a few phonics games and comprehension games on there as well.

I can see what your child has accessed too!

I will award I dojo for every 3 books your child reads on Bug Club. If your child has finished all of the books they have been set on Bug Club and I have not changed them it is because they are not ready to move onto harder books.

But as soon as your child is ready I will change them.
