Parking safely around school premises

A small minority of our car drivers think its OK for them to stop on the yellow zig zag lines outside school as its only a minute, or to park on the curb blocking the drop down curb designed to help parents with buggies, prams or wheel chairs on Twycross Grove and some of our drivers think its OK to stop on the mini roundabout on Bromford Road and let children out of their cars. Just to be clear – none of these actions are OK in fact they are really dangerous – PLEASE STOP before a child is seriously hurt or worse.

Every parent will expect road users to be considerate of your child therefore you must be considerate of other people's children too.

Before School arrangements

We are noticing more children being dropped off by parents/older siblings/family members who are not staying with the children until the school gates open. The school gates open at 8.35am and yet some children are appearing outside from as early as 8.15am. This is a safeguarding concern for us.

Breakfast club is available every day and costs 50p per child. It starts at 8am.

Can Parents please be reminded to wait with their child until a member of the school leadership opens the gates and is then able to supervise the children as they come onto school site. Before 8.35am and unless your child attends Breakfast Club, you remain responsible for your child's safety.

Is your child starting at school in September 2024?

If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, you need to apply for a new reception school place. Applications are made online at www.birmingham.gov.uk.

You must apply even if you already have a child at our school. Your rising 5-year-old will not automatically come to Hodge Hill – you must apply.

The deadline to apply is Monday 15th January. If you are unsure, please speak to our Office staff who will be able to help. If you do not apply, your child may not be allocated a place at our school.
