## Wet weather and flooding advice

Storm Henk gave many parts of the UK a bit of a battering, including the West Midlands.

You may have seen news stories about one incident, in Hall Green, where a man came to the rescue of a woman and child whose car got stuck in fast-flowing water.

It really does bring home the risks posed by flood water.

If water looks too deep to drive through, it probably is. Our advice is not to take any unnecessary risks.

Please remember: we are not a vehicle recovery service. But, if you or someone else is stranded in flood water, never get out of your vehicle. Call 999 and ask for the fire service.

#### Winter water safety

Of course, it's not just flood water that's dangerous.

'Open' water, like rivers, lakes and reservoirs, can look very picturesque and can make the ideal place for a winter walk.

But it's still cold out there, and you need to keep your wits about you when near any body of water.
