ADVICE ON KEEPING SAFE

We have received this advice from West Midlands Police and wanted to share it with you

This time of year, people are out shopping and celebrating with friends.

As the crowds grow out on the street and in bars, restaurants and clubs, we see a rise in robbery. Try following a few simple tips, you can help protect your property out on the street:

2 Listen to your head - if you don't feel safe move to a busier area.

I Know your route and avoid badly-lit streets.

I Tell a trusted person where you're going and when you'll be back.

If you take a different route home from your friends, let each other know that you've arrived safely. Apps like Whatsapp and Snapchat allow you to share your location with your friends.
Carry your bag securely. Put the strap across your body and make sure the fasteners are facing you.

If you use a cashpoint, try to do so during daylight hours. If you have to use a cashpoint at night go with a friend and stay alert to other people on the street.

2 Avoid carrying your wallet or phone in your back pocket

Don't leave your phone out on a table when socialising

Robbery – travel

During the darker nights, it can be worrying to wait for a bus or travel to the nearest station.

- 2 We want you to stay safe, so please follow these simple travelling tips
- **Stick to well-lit routes and bus stations**

2 Avoid carrying your wallet or phone in your back pocket and never hold it out on display

Z Keep valuables, especially jewellery, out of sight.

² Keep luggage close at hand at all times and in sight if possible. Don't have your name or address visible on any tags

² Keep keys separate from anything with your address on it. If you are travelling, someone may assume your house is empty

- 2 Wait for the bus, train or tram at a busy place
- 2 When on a bus, train or tram, sit downstairs and near to the driver
