## BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES AT HOLLINGWORTH SUMMER TERM REVIEW

I am extremely proud of all our pupils at Hollingworth Academy and we are consistently commended on the conduct of our pupils. We are renowned in the local area and wider for having a culture of positive choices and our students have a reputation of being polite, kind and courteous. Our academy is a calm and safe environment and that is achieved through our standards, in line with our values of **respect, responsibility** and **resilience**. Our staff work tirelessly, day in, day out, to support our pupils to get the best from their education. We end the year having given out over 560000 RISE points which is more than double what we gave out last year.

### HIGHLIGHTS

This academic year has been filled with memorable moments and outstanding achievements. Among the highlights were our **winter and summer balls**, where we celebrated pupils who consistently exceeded our high standards. These events were a true reflection of the excellence and dedication shown by our students throughout the year.

A particular standout event was the **Year 11 Prom**, held at the stunning Saddleworth Hotel. It was a fitting celebration for what is set to be a record-breaking Year 11 cohort, whose efforts have made this one of the most successful years since before the pandemic.

Our annual **Blackpool rewards trip** was another fantastic occasion. It was especially heartening to see pupils who hadn't met expectations last year rise to the challenge and earn their place this time around.

Finally, **Presentation Evening** was a true highlight of the school calendar; the evening was a celebration of the diverse successes of our pupils, from academic excellence to personal development.

## JEWELLERY

(Students are only permitted to wear a wristwatch (smart watches are not permitted) and one pair of stud earrings, no more than 5mm in diameter, 3D pearl style earrings are not permitted. All other jewellery is not permitted.)

## MAKEUP

(Makeup is only permitted for Y10 and Y11 students and must be subtle. This also applies to semi-permanent makeup such as tinted eyebrows. Fake eyelashes, false tan and artificial nails are not permitted.)

## HAIR

(Hair should be in a naturally occurring style and colour. Should not be shorter than O1 and should not have any patterns shaved or dyed in. Bows, hair ties and headbands etc. should be black in colour and be no bigger than 5cm in diameter.)

## UNIFORM & EQUIPMENT

At Hollingworth Academy we firmly believe that our **uniform, dress and appearance policy** reinforces a culture of belonging and identity. Please see our most recent uniform graphic. There has been a minor change this year which I wrote to all of you about regarding footwear. We have also tried to check and offer guidance to pupils in the academy so that footwear in line with our policy can be purchased for September 2025. Details below:

***The Kickers Tovni and similar style pumps and other branded and non-branded equivalents will no longer be allowed.*** We realise that Kickers, other brands and non-branded equivalents promote and market this footwear and similar styles as shoes; but irrespective of this they are not deemed as acceptable footwear in the academy from September. Footwear should be all black in colour, professional styles only and students should wear shoes that sit below the ankle. No boot styles are allowed. (Further details are shown on our uniform graphic )

It is vital that all of our pupils attend the academy fully equipped for their day ahead. We insist that all pupils carry a school bag and we recommend a backpack style for healthy posture (although this is not essential).

**ESSENTIAL EQUIPMENT:** School bag (rucksack/backpack style), a pencil case, 3 x black pens, 1 x green pen, 1 x pencil, a ruler, a highlighter, a pencil eraser and a scientific calculator.

**DESIRABLE EQUIPMENT:** A maths set (compass, protractor etc.), a reading book and a water bottle.



# EDUCATIONAL NEWS

## TEACHING & LEARNING AT HOLLINGWORTH SUMMER TERM REVIEW

**We are excited to share several updates and initiatives that have been implemented across the academy, designed to enhance teaching, learning and pupil success across the school. These changes aim to improve both academic progress and overall pupil wellbeing:**



At Hollingworth, we want to develop a truly world class curriculum with high-quality teaching that ensures "Everyone Excels Everyday".

### CURRICULUM REVIEWS

We have completed a thorough review of all subject curriculums to ensure they are relevant, rigorous, and well-sequenced across all year groups. This allows each subject to build effectively on prior learning and prepare pupils for future success. Emphasising our world class school status, we've ensured our curriculum is ambitious, cohesive, and challenging, helping pupils make strong connections and excel in their learning.

### ASSESSMENT TRAINING FOR DEPARTMENT LEADERS

Heads of Department have undertaken bespoke CPD on assessment structures, focusing on reliability, validity, and sequencing. This training supports more accurate, fair assessments that reflects pupils' learning and highlights both strengths and areas for improvement.

### ASSESSMENT OVERVIEWS FOR PARENTS/CARERS

To increase transparency and help parents/carers better support their child's learning, we are developing assessment overviews for all subjects. These will outline upcoming assessments, formats, and focus areas helping pupils prepare effectively and reduce stress, and allowing them to focus on mastering key concepts in advance.

### SPARX READER PILOT STUDY

Following a successful pilot with Years 7 and 9, the SPARX Reader Programme will expand to Years 7–10 next year. This tool strengthens reading skills and boosts attainment across subjects by improving pupils' ability to engage with complex texts; ultimately improving their academic performance and confidence.

### E-PLATFORM FOR READING FOR PLEASURE

Our popular e-Platform, with over 1,500 monthly e-book loans, remains available over the summer to encourage reading for pleasure. This supports literacy, broadens vocabulary, and fosters a love of learning that contributes to their overall academic success.

### DATA ACTION REPORTS FOR PUPIL PROGRESS

After each report cycle, departments now complete Data Action Reports to identify areas for improvement and plan interventions. This process ensures tailored support for pupils, helping close attainment gaps and promote progress.

### NGRT TESTING

All pupils have completed NGRT (New Group Reading Test) assessments under exam conditions. Results will inform future planning and literacy strategies, enabling targeted support to strengthen foundational reading skills across the curriculum.

### CPD TRAINING FOR SENIOR LEADERS

Senior leaders have received training on setting effective targets in line with proposed OFSTED changes. We remain committed to delivering a world class education, ensuring every pupil succeeds through focused and impactful school development.

We remain committed to delivering the best possible learning experience for all pupils. By adapting our approach to meet their needs, we aim to support their progress and help them reach their full potential. We look forward to working with you on this journey.

#### HOUSE SYSTEM FUNDRAISING

As part of the competitive element of the House system, the academy has been proud to raise over **£550 for Cash for Kids** to combat knife crime, over **£600 for BBC Children in Need** and over **£1000 for Comic Relief**. This has occurred through bake sale, own clothes days and design a gingerbread biscuit competition.



#### CAREERS

Careers continues to be an outstanding element of life at Hollingworth. With **124 careers-based opportunities** offered so far this year. These have included workshops with HMRC, KPMG, and Siemens, as well as sessions with local businesses like ICON Sports, EQUANS, and NatWest.

In line with Gatsby Benchmark 6, students have taken part in **287 workplace safaris**, giving them valuable insight into different industries. Led by our Careers Leader, Cate Calveley, Hollingworth continues to set an example in careers education, working closely with Mayor Andy Burnham to support the MBacc initiative. Highlights this year include:

#### RISE

This year's **RISE curriculum** took a thematic approach, covering Health and Wellbeing, Relationships and Sex Education, and Living in the Wider World. Key topics included sexual orientation, radicalisation, knife crime and careers. Learning was enriched through guest speakers and performances, including the No Knives Tour. Year 7 and Year 10 also took part in the Bee Well survey to support future curriculum planning and staff received targeted CPD to strengthen subject knowledge and delivery.

## PRESENTATION EVENING



It was a truly memorable night, recognising the dedication, talent and success of our students.



## HOLLINGWORTH ACADEMY PROUDLY WELCOMES ANDY BURNHAM, MAYOR OF GREATER MANCHESTER

We were honoured to welcome Andy Burnham, Mayor of Greater Manchester, to the academy this term as part of his visit to see how schools are driving forward the future of education and technical skills in the region. His visit placed a spotlight on our role in the Manchester Baccalaureate (MBacc), a pioneering initiative that's shaping the next generation of skilled professionals across Greater Manchester.



As a flagship school for the MBacc, we are incredibly proud to be leading the way. Hollingworth Academy is currently the most engaged school in the region when it comes to developing the MBacc – from contributing to pilot programmes and joining regional steering groups to forming vital partnerships with employers. This means we are not only delivering high-quality education but also helping to design what the future of education looks like across Greater Manchester.

A key part of our involvement is through the MBacc Equalex pilot, developed by The Careers & Enterprise Company in partnership with the Greater Manchester Combined Authority. This innovative project introduces a new model of work experience, offering students at least 50 hours of meaningful and tailored workplace learning between Years 9 and 11. It is a step beyond the traditional one-week placement, helping our students build confidence and real-world skills that connect directly to future careers.



During his visit, Mr Burnham met with students and staff, took a tour of our Food Technology and Construction learning spaces, and delivered an inspiring address to Year 8 and 9 students. He also heard directly from our pupils about their careers education experiences and the tangible difference the MBacc is already making to their aspirations.

At Hollingworth, we believe every pupil should leave school with the knowledge, skills and ambition to thrive — and that's exactly what the MBacc helps us deliver. This visit was a chance for our pupils to see that what they're doing in school today connects directly to the world of work, to further study, and to a future full of opportunity.

With Rochdale set to benefit from transformative regeneration projects like Atom Valley, we know how important it is to prepare our students with the technical skills and career confidence they'll need to seize these opportunities. This visit from the Mayor reinforced the vital role Hollingworth Academy is playing in shaping the borough's future, building a strong, skilled and ambitious workforce for generations to come.

### ICON SPORTS - WORKPLACE SAFARI

This term, we proudly hosted an **exhibition** to celebrate the hard work and creative achievements of our **Year 11 GCSE Art & Photography pupils**.






#### YEAR 7 – AFRICAN ART


#### YEAR 8 – MEXICAN ART



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### GEOGRAPHY - GLACIAL DEPOSITION


