# THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION AT HOLLINGWORTH SPRING TERM

As we reach the end of the spring term, we are now into the "business end" of the academic year. Our Year 11 students are fully into their revision sessions after school and have completed their second set of mock exams. They are working hard to ensure they are ready to perform at their best level and we are proud of their efforts so far. We all have to work together to support them all the way to the end of their exams. We believe they can achieve the best set of results that our academy has had. At Hollingworth, we are aiming to develop a "World Class Curriculum" with high-quality teaching that enables our students to be World Class.

Our other year groups continue to work hard on their learning too. We have done a great deal of work on our academy website to ensure that you can see what your child is learning at any point in the academic year. For every subject, we have published our "Visual Learning Journey" and given you key questions that you can ask your child. If you find your child does not want to talk about their day at school, our website can give you specific details about what they have been studying. Try viewing some of our "Visual Learning Journeys" and "Curriculum Maps" and asking your child some of suggested key questions.

Can I also remind you that all homework is set on Google Classroom. This is the place to check what homework has been set and what your child is doing to consolidate their learning. Maths use Sparx and Science use Seneca Learning – but this will be set via Google Classroom. We try to set quizzes and other activities to check what has been learnt in class. Try to ask your child to show you their Google Classroom work.

We have now been using our "PRIME Learning" model with our students for two terms. This is all about teaching our students to become better learners. Here is the model again, so please try and talk about it with your children. The more we can talk to them about how they learn, the more they will grow.

### BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES AT HOLLINGWORTH SPRING TERM REVIEW

"Behaviour is outstanding" – this is the resounding feedback we receive when visitors attend the academy. It truly is a testament to the kind and respectful nature of the students we have here at Hollingworth Academy. We pride ourselves on appropriate levels of challenge and encourage our students to demonstrate RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY and RESILIENCE.

To date there have been a significant number of students in the academy who haven't gained a single FALL point and a significant amount of students who have only received one. Overall, 49% of the collective student body have managed to make it more than halfway through the year with 1 or 0 FALL points; this is highly commendable and something I am very proud of the students for achieving.
