



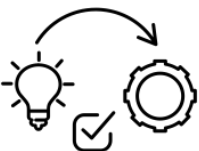
INTENT - We aim to...

Latin

At Holme C of E Primary Academy we believe that pupils' acquisition and command of vocabulary are key to learning across the curriculum.



At Holme C of E Primary Academy we have chosen to teach Latin because of the rich opportunities that come with learning this ancient language. As well as being a fascinating language in its own right, knowledge of Latin helps to develop literacy skills. Through Latin, children develop their knowledge of spelling and vocabulary through learning Latin roots of English words and deepening their understanding of grammar. Alongside language learning, the study of Roman and Greek civilisations aids cultural literacy, encourages cultural insights and gives opportunities for wide-ranging thinking across many linked subjects (including history, philosophy, art, maths and science).

Intercultural Understanding

Etymology of words in English and other languages-roots in Latin and deepening comprehension of the meaning of modern words.

Learning new words in conversations and texts, identifying connections and grammar. Dictionary skills.

Grammar

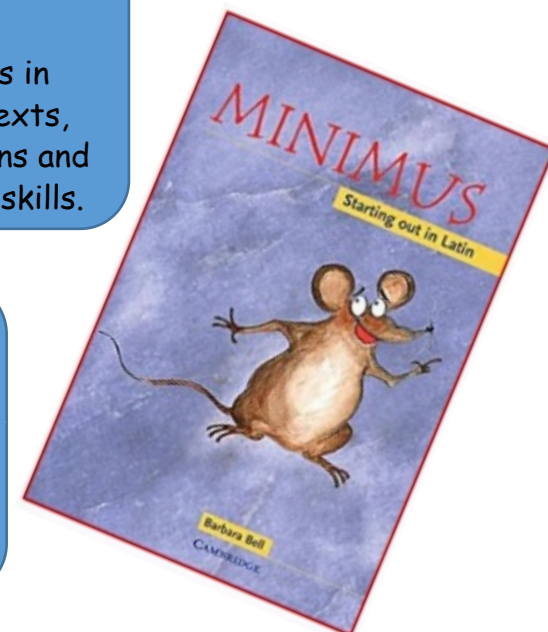
Phrase and sentence building through understanding grammar conventions.

Conversational Language (Listening and Speaking)

Application of learnt vocabulary through scaffolded conversation. Encouraging enjoyment of language.

Translation (Reading and Writing)

Application of learned vocabulary and grammar to build understanding of words, phrases, sentences and texts.





IMPACT - How will we know when we have achieved our aims?

Through our Latin curriculum we aim to ensure the pupils have the opportunity to meet the national curriculum requirements as follows:

- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding
- Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words
- Speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures
- Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing
- Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language
- Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary
- Write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly
- Describe people, places, things and actions in writing
- Understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including (where relevant): feminine, masculine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high-frequency verbs; key features and patterns of the language; how to apply these, for instance, to build sentences; and how these differ from or are similar to English.
