BENEFITS TO STUDENTS

Students who complete the 'Step Up' programme are guaranteed to receive a reduced UCAS offer of up to 2 A-level grades (or equivalent), compared to standard course entry requirements, should they subsequently apply for an undergraduate place at LJMU.

There is a 1 A-level grade reduction (or equivalent) for entry to the Foundation Year of an undergraduate degree programme.

Students must therefore attend every session in order to qualify for the reduced offer, in addition to meeting all of the stated conditions of their offer.

STEP UP IN YEAR 9

SESSIONS 1&2: AT SCHOOL

In the first session we will guide you through the Step Up programme, and the commitment needed from you. We will also get to know eachother whilst gauging existing knowledge of higher education (HE), and discover your subjects of interest This will then allow us to run some introductory activities about the university experience and student life, introducing you to some of our current LJMU students.

SESSION 3: AT LJMU

We aim to provide inspiration to students. In what is likely to be a first visit to university, you will explore the campus, view facilities and take part in hands-on experiences to raise awareness of HE. These opportunities will build confidence, knowledge and skills, as you engage with current LJMU student advocates.

STEP UP IN YEAR 10

SESSIONS 1&2: AT SCHOOL

In Year 10 you will be encouraged to start exploring careers and course choices, with a focus on interview techniques, experience a mock interview and learn more about skills which are valued by sixth forms, colleges and employers alike.
