Year 9 Options Information Evening, Thursday 9th March 2023 @ 6.00 p.m. (School Hall)

This is the term that your child will make their Key Stage 4 option choices (what they wish to study in Years 10 & 11). On Thursday 9th March at 6.00 p.m. in the School Hall, we are hosting an 'Options Information Evening' about the processes and timeline for choosing their options. All parents are welcome to attend. If you are unable to attend we will make the presentation and options booklet available to you on the school's website.

We recognise that making decisions about what subjects to study in Year 10 and thinking about future career choices may seem daunting. What is most important is that all students select subjects that best suit their needs and aspirations. With this in mind there are a number of events taking place this term to help support you and your child in making these decisions:

Timeline

The key dates are as follows:

- Wednesday 1st, Thursday 2nd and Friday 3rd March Assemblies are being held to inform our children of the options available and the process/timeline. In these assemblies all subjects will talk about their subject content in Years 10 & 11, and how they are examined.
- **Monday 6th March** during their Personal Development lesson, all Year 9 classes will look at what they should consider to help them make their option choices.
- Year 9 Options Evening, Thursday 9th March @ 6.00 p.m. in the School Hall this will be an opportunity for parents to hear about the options process and to explain the pathways students can follow, along with guidance on how to choose. This will be led by members of the Senior Leadership Team who will also be available during the evening to answer any questions you may have.
- Tuesday 14th March, Year 9 Parent's Evening on the School Cloud this is an opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their subject teachers and for them to answer any questions you may have about options.
- Student interviews will take place this term, giving students the opportunity to discuss the most appropriate pathway and subjects for them. Parents can also request a meeting with staff if they would like more support during the process.
- Options booklet a booklet will be available for students and parents from Thursday 9th March which provides information about the subjects they can study and the options process. This will be made available via our website.
- Thursday 30th March deadline for options to be submitted online.
- This deadline is to give us an idea on the number of classes needed and options requested, it helps us with our planning. Lots of children change their mind between now and September, and we always do our very best to make the changes happen for them.

Options and Pathways

All our students study the following:

- English Language and English Literature (2 GCSEs)
- Mathematics (1 GCSE)
- Combined Science (2 GCSEs)
- RE (1 GCSE)
- Core PE (not examined)
- Personal Development/PSCHE (not examined)
- 3 option subjects

Ebacc Pathway: You may be aware that there is a national expectation that a certain percentage of students should follow an Ebacc pathway. To achieve the Ebacc, students must to take a Humanity subject (Geography or History) <u>and</u> a Modern Foreign Language (French or Spanish). Some children may be encouraged to consider an Ebacc pathway.

Some of our students will follow a more bespoke curriculum and we will contact their families in person to arrange a meeting to discuss this further.
