(MP from the Common of Our Lady or Thursday week 257) People encouraged to write their name or the name of someone sick they especially want to remember and place it in a suitably dignified box near to the relics.

9:30 am Rosary. (Perhaps first decade lead by Cathedral Primary school with

other school parties invited to be present) The Joyful Mysteries.

10:00 am - noon Individual School visits. (Recommended maximum of three schools at

a time. Possibility of leading own times of prayer) Children invited to bring flowers to place before relics plus a photo of someone sick who

they wish to pray for.

Each Monday, the Chaplaincy team collected pennies after worship and collected enough to sponsor a child for the year.





