Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> to Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2022

**Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup>**

- 8:00 am **Relics arrive.** Unpacking Reliquary and setting QLL Statue and information panels.
- 8:30 am **Liturgy of Welcome** with Bishop Paul Swarbrick. Process down the main aisle. Reliquary installed in suitable place of honour before the sanctuary steps and honoured with incense. Bishop at Cathedral. Any of Chapter present into stalls. Sing Office of Morning Prayer. (MP from the Common of Our Lady or Thursday week 25?) People encouraged to write their name or the name of someone sick they especially want to remember and place it in a suitably dignified box near to the relics.
- 9:30 am **Rosary.** (Perhaps first decade lead by Cathedral Primary school with other school parties invited to be present) The Joyful Mysteries.
- 10:00 am – noon **Individual School visits.** (Recommended maximum of three schools at a time. Possibility of leading own times of prayer) Children invited to bring flowers to place before relics plus a photo of someone sick who they wish to pray for.


## About us

Either way, this season of Lent we are walking to help people around the world who are less fortunate than us.

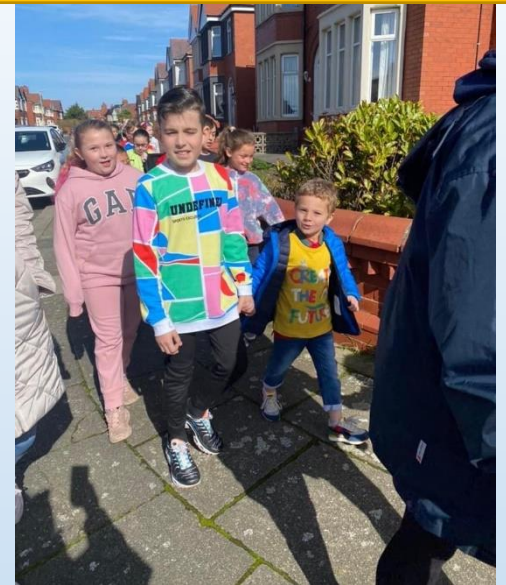
We will also hold an Easter Raffle, a Best Bonnet and decorated Egg competitions on the last week – 3-5<sup>th</sup> April

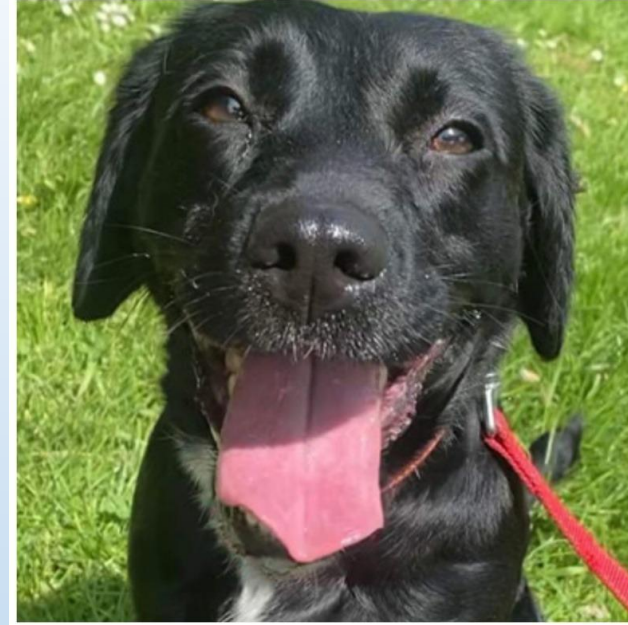
