### Sunrise Breakfast Club

The breakfast club is available each morning, during term time from 7.45 am. The cost is currently  $\pounds 5.00$  per child per day, which includes breakfast of cereal, toast, fruit, yoghurt, juice, milk or water. During breakfast club the children are supervised at all times and they also have the option to take part in a number of fun activities. Staff also ensure that all children are taken to class for the start of the school day.

### Sunset After School Club

The after school club is available each day, during term time from 3.30 pm to 5.30 pm. Attendance is split into two sessions, 3.30 pm to 4.30 pm, then 4.30 pm to 5.30 pm. Children are welcome to stay for just one session or both sessions, as required. The cost is currently £5.00 per session includes a snack, organised games and activities.

### **Illness & Absence**

It is important that children arrive at school between 8.40 am and 8.55 am, so they are ready for the start of the school day at 9.00 am. Any children arriving after this time will receive a late mark in the register. If children are going to be absent from school due to illness, we do request that parents and carers contact school by telephone or email before 9.15 am, with the reason for absence.

### **School Meals**

School meals are provided by the Bishop Hogarth Catholic Education Trust catering service. The menu has a varied choice of meals which are designed to suit all diets. As meals are prepared in our own kitchen, we are able to cater for children who have allergies, special dietary or medical needs. We are always happy to discuss any child's specific requirements.

There is no charge for children in Reception Class, Year 1 and Year 2 as they currently qualify for Universal Infant Free School Meals, an initiative funded by the Government to provide each child with a school meal, free of charge, every day.

For Children in Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6, school meals are charged at £2.20 per day (£11.00 per week). We do also have children who prefer to bring a packed lunch instead.



### Our Curriculum

Our aim is to provide our children with an engaging, exciting and empowering curriculum that equips them both for today and tomorrow.

At Holy Family School, the curriculum is designed to promote an enjoyment of learning, which is 'knowledge rich', recognises children's prior learning, provides first hand learning experiences, allows the children to develop interpersonal skills, builds resilience and empowers them to become creative and critical thinkers. Every child is recognised as a unique individual, made in the image of God. We celebrate and welcome differences within our school community, with a vision to respect and care for all, to make positive friendships and prepare them for life beyond primary school. We believe that it is important for all of our children to learn about and be proud of Darlington and its heritage, getting involved in local festivals and activities to foster a pride for their local area and be positive citizens within it. We want our children to also be aware of the wider world beyond Darlington and the lives of others throughout the world.

We believe that childhood should be a happy, investigative and enquiring time in our lives, where there are no limits to curiosity and there is a thirst for new experiences and knowledge. We are guided by our Trust Virtues, which are Resilience, Honesty, Compassion, Justice, Confidence, Respect and Self-belief. These promote positive attitudes to learning and life and which reflect the values and skills needed to promote responsibility for their own future success and the social conscience to help others.

We want children to leave Holy Family with a strong sense of belonging to a tightly knit and happy community, where they have the confident and skills to make good decisions, self-evaluate, make connections and become lifelong learners.



# Catholic Life

### <u>RE</u>

'Seeing Christ in Ourselves and Others' is at the heart of our Religious Education. We follow the 'Come and See' programme from Reception Class to Year 6. The programme has been developed to respond to the need of children in their faith journey, to enable them to grow in their religious literacy and understanding in a way that is coherent with current educational principles

### **Collective Worship**

Mrs Weatherall plans and leads collective worship with the whole school every Monday morning. Each week, collective worship is linked to the Gospel readings from Sunday Mass, as well as relevant themes linking to our liturgical year and diocesan themes such as, Year of Mary and Oscar Romero. On other days each class plan and deliver collective worship for their peers, guided by their Teacher. Again, this links to the liturgical year as well as events of the week.

'Special Mentions' for children's achievements and celebrations from the week take place during our Friday collective worship. Each class also take it in turns to lead a liturgy for the whole school. Families and parishioners are invited to come along

### **First Holy Communion**

The First Holy Communion programme is available to children in Year 4 within Holy Family Parish, who are baptised Roman Catholic. The programme is organised and led by Parish Catechists. School staff work in partnership with the Parish to help the children prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.

The First Holy Communion programme was implemented in 2011 by the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle. Preparation sessions and Masses for children and families are held throughout the year, with the First Holy Communion Mass and celebration usually taking place in the Summer term.





# Early Years Foundation Stage

From September 2023, we are delighted to confirm that the Early Years Foundation Stage provision at Holy Family School now includes a Nursery Class and a Reception Class.

The Nursery offers both funded and paid nursery places to children aged 3 years old and is open during term time only. All children aged 3 years old are able to access 15 hours free childcare each week. Some families may also be entitled to 30 hours free child care. Please see our Nursery Prospectus and website for more information.

Pupils in Nursery and Reception Class follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. There are 7 areas of learning with 3 prime areas.

These areas include:

- **\*** Personal, Social & Emotional Development
- Physical Development
- ★ Literacy
- **\*** Mathematics
- ★ Understanding The World
- \* Expressive Arts & Design

We see reading as a key to a wealth of future learning and we have starting points based upon quality books. These will also include books about major festivals and seasons of the year. These topics then develop following children's interests, observations and ongoing assessments. Child initiated themes are encouraged for exploration and investigation.





At Holy Family, we are committed to supporting the needs of all pupils by providing an inclusive curriculum to ensure that all children are nurtured to reach and achieve their full potential. We aim to provide a supportive environment in order to promote learning, enable personal growth and development.

The individual needs of all children are at the core of the carefully planned curriculum and activities. Fully qualified and experienced Teachers and Teaching Assistants ensure that all pupils are provided with the appropriate level of support alongside their peers. Staff like to develop a close working relationship with children, their families and any supporting outside agencies that may also come into school to support a child's learning and development

# Safeguarding

Children learn best when they are healthy, safe and secure, when their individual needs are met and when they have positive relationships with the adults caring for them.

The Safeguarding Policy and procedures at Holy Family Catholic Primary School, which includes the Nursery, are in place to ensure children are educated in a welcoming, safe and stimulating environment where children are able to enjoy learning and grow in confidence.

## Extra Curricular & Enrichment

### **Homework**

Homework is set on a regular basis. Children in Reception Class, will bring home reading books, phonics work and mathematics tasks.

### Reading

We would like children to read as much as possible, a minimum of 3 nights per week and learn multiplication tables. On each class page on our website there are details of recommended reads and links to different online resources to help children learn in a fun and interactive way.

#### Activities & Events

Children have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of activities across each year group, such as swimming, musical instrument tuition, the school choir and sporting activities. All children get the chance to participate in a wide variety of events which we regularly attend along with other Primary Schools from the Darlington area, such as cross country, golf, football, hockey, tennis, tag rugby, netball, athletics, dance and swimming. Throughout the school year, we always try to have a wide range of lunch time and after school activities to appeal to all interests, these have included dance, sports, film club, music, Spanish and journalism.

#### **School Trips**

Each class also enjoys a variety of age appropriate school trips and excursions which are often linked to their topic work in school. These have included visits to Beamish Museum, Holy Island in Northumberland, Darlington Hippodrome Theatre, Bowes Museum, Hall Hill Farm plus an annual residential trip for pupils in Year 6.

#### **School Council**

We have an active School Council at Holy Family School. The Council members include representatives from each class. They have regular meetings with staff members and work on initiatives that the whole school can also be involved in.

#### Mini Vinnies

Our Mini Vinnies work extremely hard to turn concern into action. They follow the simple formula 'See, Think, Do!' They actively try and find people or groups in need and help them. Their recent work has included collecting for the local food banks to help different local community areas and they collected hats, gloves and scarfs for a charity for homeless people.

All fundraising events are held for the benefit of the children, to promote their education and curriculum enrichment at all levels. Staff and family members work throughout the year and organise a range of events. These events provide ideal opportunities to get to know others, as well as raising funds for the school. We hope that families will make every effort to support us.




## Bishop Hogarth Catholic Education Trust


