Love is Our Vocation

Today is known as Good Shepherd Sunday and is also called Vocations Sunday. The idea of vocation is central to the Christian belief that God has created each person with gifts and talents oriented toward specific purposes and a way of life. In the broadest sense, 'Love is the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being.' (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2392).

A shepherd is a common image of leadership in Hebrew scripture. In Jesus, we see that it's about the loving relationship between the shepherd and the sheep. It is about knowing each one by name, knowing who we truly are. Whatever our life circumstances, love is our vocation. Whether we shepherd one other individual, a small group or a large community, 'we are called to be a Sacrament of the mystical, a reminder for others of their divine loveliness. Our calling is not to introduce something new, but to reveal what is already there.' (Daniel O' Leary)

John O' Donohue offers a blessing on our vocation to loving leadership. The beauty of a blessing, he says, is the belief that it can affect what it unfolds.

May the gift of leadership awaken in you as a vocation,
Keep you mindful of the providence that calls you to serve.
When the way is flat and dull in times of grey endurance,
May your imagination continue to evoke horizons.

May you know the wisdom of deep listening, the healing of wholesome words,
The encouragement of the appreciative gaze, the decorum of held dignity.
May you learn to cultivate the art of presence
In order to engage with those who meet you.
May those you meet know that you see and respect them.

In your heart may there be a sanctuary for the stillness where clarity is born.
May you have the wisdom to read time clearly
