Children in school....

We are providing as many places as we can in line with our risk assessment, for children of critical workers and pupils from vulnerable families. As you can appreciate, this is a very difficult situation to manage. There is a high demand for places, and while we are doing our best to accommodate requests for children to be in school, this is balanced against a duty to operate safely, in line with our risk assessment.

Lancashire County Council are fully supportive of schools making decisions on this basis and support the following priority list for both parents:

- NHS frontline staff or administrators (eg NHS 911) whose work is critical during the pandemic
- First responders
- Police Officers and some civilian police staff
- Firefighters
- Those in NHS support services needed to help hospitals and clinics running
- School staff who are attending on site provision at their own schools

The reason it is our aim to keep the number of pupils low is to ensure that our school does not promote the transmission of COVID.
