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It's the fifth Sunday of Lent, when Jesus tells us that death is not the end.....

The Gospel of John 12:20-33

Jesus said to his disciples, Andrew and Philip, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. In truth, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit."

In the Gospel reading, Jesus predicted that very soon he would die and rise from the dead. This is what he meant when he said that he would be 'glorified'. His death would not be the end, but rather, the beginning of a new life with God our Father in heaven. To help his disciples understand, he asked them to think about a wheat seed.

Jesus was saying that his death would be like this – he was going to die and be buried in the silence and darkness of the tomb. But then, by God's power, he would be brought into a new and everlasting life with God the Father. This is exactly what happened to Jesus on Easter Sunday and it is this everlasting life with him that what God wants for all of us.

Restrictions on travelling abroad - Easter holidays - guidance from Lancashire county council

- Whilst the stay at home restrictions are in place, people are only allowed to travel abroad if they have a legally permitted reason.
- It is illegal to leave home without a reasonable excuse. This means that, all returnees to the UK must book two PCR tests (for day 2 and 8 on their return) before they are allowed to travel back to the UK for PCR test and returnees must either quarantine in the place they're staying or in a managed quarantine hotel for 10 days when they arrive in England.

In light of this guidance, anyone who travels abroad during school holidays will need to evidence negative tests on return.
