


## Our Autumn Term Curriculum

<p><b>In RE:</b></p> <p>Our topics in R.E. this term are '<b>Creation</b>' and '<b>The Commandments</b>'.</p> <p>We will explore the story of creation and think about its meaning.</p> <p>We will look at what God means when He asked us to be stewards of the Earth.</p> <p>The children will look at the fall and it's meaning for human life.</p> <p>We will also understand the importance of the commandments and that they are a gift from God to help us.</p>	<p><b>In English</b></p> <p>There will be independent reading time, the children are encouraged to choose a book to read from the school library. Our English work this half term will be based around these topics:</p> <p><b>Myths and Legend stories and persuasion</b> ~ We will plan and write our own myths and legend stories based on Anglo Saxon Legend and Greek Mythology. We will look at stories from Anglo Saxon times and we will develop texts to discuss issues of Anglo Saxon era.</p> <p><b>Stories with historical settings, film and play scripts and classic narrative poetry</b> Children will look at a variety of different fiction genres, expressing personal preference before writing their own short texts and poetry linked to a historical setting.</p>		<p><b>In Math's</b></p> <p>We will be learning about:</p> <p>Rounding any number up to 1 000 000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10 000 and 100 000.</p> <p>Adding and subtracting whole numbers with more than 4 digits and decimals with two decimal places.</p> <p>Drawing given angles and measuring them in degrees (°).</p> <p>We will identify how to multiply and divide numbers using our whole school approach.</p> <p>We will interpret and develop knowledge of statistics and graphical representation.</p> <p><b>Children will also revise their times tables and quick recall of them.</b></p>		
<p><b>Science</b></p> <p><b>The Properties of Materials</b></p> <p>This unit builds upon exploring materials, to consider how materials can be changed and adapted. This is presented in various ways, such as chemical and physical changes. The children will discover more about the molecular structure of materials, in simple terms, and gain an understanding of changes that are reversible and irreversible.</p>	<p>Year 5 Autumn Term</p> 		<p><b>History</b></p> <p>The children will study aspects of cultural, economic, military, political religious and social history of the Anglo Saxons and Romans.</p>	<p><b>Computing</b></p> <p>In Computing systems and Networks, children will identify and explore how information is shared between digital systems. In the video editing unit they will learn how to editing video clips to produce a short film.</p>	
<p><b>PE</b></p> <p>In our invasion games unit we will be looking at football skills and developing our teamwork skills through physical problem solving activities. We will be going to the local swimming pool later in the term to develop our strokes. In dance we will be using movements to convey emotions of characters and working in groups to produce a sequence linking travel, jump, turn, gesture and stillness.</p>	<p><b>Latin</b></p> <p>Children will be learning about a Roman soldier's life, Roman jewellery, Roman clothes and cosmetics.</p>	<p><b>Music</b></p> <p>We will be learning how rock music developed from the Beatles onwards and applying our glockenspiel skills in composition activities in our Jazz unit.</p>	<p><b>PSHE</b></p> <p>In our myHappyMind journals we will be learning more about our wonderful brains and how we can control how our brain operates.</p>	<p><b>Art/D &amp; T</b></p> <p>The children begin by researching Anglo-Saxon jewellery (brooches, necklaces), They will develop their own designs and create their own jewellery.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b></p> <p>Home reading is crucial. Children will be given school reading books. We will also be working in class on our guided reading book activities.</p>
