It's been a very busy week this week at school.

On Tuesday, we welcomed our new Reception parents to a coffee morning so they could meet the staff as well as each other. It was very well attended and we will be holding another one next Wednesday morning.

"Awesome!" and "Best Trip Ever!" were just a couple of the exclamations from Year 2s on their Trip to the British Motor Museum at Gaydon in Warwickshire on Thursday. After meeting 'Herbert Austin' (the first man to mass produce cars in Britain) and 'Bertha Benz' (the first ever driver of a motorised vehicle) we got to see, touch and even sit in many of the amazing, old vehicles in the exhibitions. "All aboard!" shouted Kiara and Sonny as we sat on a 100 year old wooden London bus and sang songs. This very active and busy day finished with a Science investigations into frictions surfaces on distances travelled of lego cars.

On Thursday, Year 3 went to visit Ufton Court for an immersive ancient Egyptian experience. We learnt about some of the superstitions held by Ancient Egyptians when dealing with the dead, whilst taking part in a drama to embalm a Prince. We also looked at Ancient Egyptian artefacts and learnt more about how Egyptians use different types of writing by making our own ink to write with and having a go at being a trainee scribe!

Today the Reception children went to The Story Museum in Oxford. They began their visit by putting on spacesuits and listening to a story set in Space. They carried on their adventure with a story journey featuring lots of fictional characters.
