
October is the month of the Holy Rosary. What is the Rosary?

The Word Rosary means 'Garland of Roses'.
Rosary beads are made up of five decades
(sets of 10 beads) with individual beads in
between, and a crucifix. This helps us to keep
track of our Prayers.

It is said that Our Lady revealed the Rosary to St. Dominic offering it as a way to think about the mysteries of the life of Jesus in a way that is easy to understand.

The original 15 mysteries were divided into Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries. Pope John Paul 11 added the Luminous mysteries or better known as the Mysteries of Light in 2002..
