
The day concluded with pupils writing a supportive message on a paper candle.

We are incredibly proud of our Year 11 student who had his work experience in our school kitchen with Mrs Bourke.


Our student said he really enjoyed working with Mrs Bourke in the kitchen and having this opportunity to learn new skills.

#### **Cultural Assembly**








#### INNOVATING EDUCATION WITH LEGO SPIKE PRIME!

We are thrilled to announce our exciting collaboration with the Royal Air Force and the Smallpeice Trust, bringing the innovative LEGO SPIKE Prime to our school! Mrs Gillies attended the training course and has initially rolled out the program to a small group of Year 9 students. Their first trial runs with the RoboDog, Grabber, and Bike robots have been a huge success.

Our students have been building and programming these robots to perform a variety of tasks. Mrs Gillies is hopeful to roll out this program to other students, enabling them to create their own successful builds and develop essential STEM skills.



Our Year 11 BTEC Sport students have been excelling in their recent assessments, stepping up to plan and deliver their own PE lessons for their peers. 

the progress they have made.






















#### **EXCITING NEWS!**
