
I have included the information about arrangements for September in this newsletter, so please make sure that you read the information carefully so that you and your child are fully prepared.

School Uniform

Attendance



Whole-School Attendance for 2021-2023: 95%

Target for 2022-2023: 97%

If your child is ill or unable to attend school for any reason, you must let us know by telephone on the first morning of absence. Mrs Moss will telephone you if no message is received. Any child absent without an appropriate reason, will be recorded as unauthorised and this may result in a penalty notice being issued by the local authority.

Please be reminded that holidays will not be permitted, unless they are exceptional circumstances. You must complete a holiday request form as soon as possible.

We send out letters to parents whose child's attendance has fallen to 96% or below. We hope that you understand that we have a duty to alert parents to their child's attendance.

Ongoing poor attendance (below 90%) is shared with our Education Welfare Officer (EWO). This can lead to an Attendance Meeting at school. The aim of these meetings is to give school, parents and the EWO the chance to sit together and look at reasons for absence, the impact this is having, and then discuss ways to improve the situation.

School Equipment

For children in Class 1, school will provide all the resources and equipment required.



For children in Class 2 and 3, bring in their own labelled pencil case and equipment. We suggest that children have their own pencil case with a pencil, rubber, sharpener, ruler, Pritt stick, a highlighter and colouring pencils. For those children writing in pen, they are encouraged to have a blue rub-out Frixion pen (see link below).



We actively encourage children to regularly read at home. It has such a positive impact on all areas of your child's learning and confidence. Little and often is best. Please sign the Home Reading planner each time your child reads. We will continue with our '5 times a reader' from September. If your child reads five times a week and their planner is signed, they will be entered into the weekly draw. The winner will be announced during the weekly achievement assembly, and they will receive a prize of a book.

Spelling Bee

In September, we will be launching our Spelling Bee. We will be hosting the termly MAT School Spelling Bee at the end of each term. The aim of the Spelling Bee is to celebrate the effort that the children are making with their spellings.



When will the children be tested?

The children will have until the final week of each term to learn their spellings. The class teachers will quiz the children in the class. All children will have a chance to celebrate their achievements. Children do not have to enter; however, practising these spellings regularly at home may give them confidence to take part. All children who take part in the Spelling Bee will receive a certificate in recognition of their achievement.

At the end of the summer term, a selection of children will be selected to participate in the Cross-MAT Spelling Bee Competition to
