<u>Attendance</u>



Target for 2022-2023: 97% As we are 'back to normal' improving attendance is now a top priority of the MAT. If your child is ill or unable to attend school for any reason, you must let us know by telephone or email the office the first morning of absence. Mrs Moss will telephone you if you haven't contacted her about the absence. Any child absent without an appropriate reason, will be recorded as unauthorised and this may result in a penalty notice being issued by the local authority.

Please be reminded that holidays will not be permitted unless they are exceptional circumstances. You must complete a holiday request form as soon as possible.

We send out letters to parents whose child's attendance has fallen to 96% or below. We hope that you understand that we have a duty to alert parents to their child's attendance.

Ongoing poor attendance (below 90%) will lead to an Attendance Meeting at school. The aim of these meetings is to give school and parents the chance to sit together and look at reasons for absence, the impact this is having, and then discuss ways to improve the situation. Persistent Absences will be referred to our Education Welfare Officer (EWO).

Important!

Please note- collection at the end of the day will now be from the main playground, through the pedestrian gate. We will no longer be using the car park, due to health and safety. As we trial this new procedure, to alleviate congestion, Class 1 will come out at

Collection at the end of the day

Reminder of end of day procedures the slightly earlier time of 3:25. Please note that the car parks gates will be locked during collection time. We will review this new procedure again at half term. Thank you for your support with this.

- School finishes at 3:30pm and children should be collected by a known adult from the main playground, unless they are staying for an after-school club.
- Where a person other than the child's parent or carer is collecting a child from school, school must be informed in advance. Teachers **will not** release a child to go with an unknown adult or to another parent without this advance notification.
- Late collection is monitored by Miss Mills.
- Children in Year 5 and Year 6 are allowed to walk home alone once school has received written consent.
- Early Years and Key Stage 1 children will only be released to a sibling older than 16 years of age.
- Key Stage 2 children may be released to siblings over the age of 14 at the request of a parent. Any request made for a Key Stage 2 child to be collected by sibling of high school age but under 14 will be considered in exceptional circumstances.
