




Tips for starting school:

Here are a few ways in which you can support your child with getting ready to start school.













Ways to support your child's learning this year:

- Talk to your child about what they have been doing at school.
- Share daily the books that your children will be bringing home.
- Practise sounds and words sent home.
- Work with your children on their homework activity grids which we will be sending home periodically.
- Counting numbers, objects and movements to 20 and beyond.
- Recognising numbers in the environment, i.e. numbers on doors, in shops, on car number plates.

Summer Reading Bingo: Summer Reading Bingo!

The Summer Reading Bingo is an activity for children to complete over the summer holidays. The focus is on reading for pleasure experiences rather than specific texts, with activities like *make a den and read inside, read in the dark using a torch* and *read to a pet or a soft toy*.
