# **MEDICINE**

Due to school policy we are only able to administer prescribed medications in school.

Medicine that needs be taken three times a day should be given at breakfast, immediately after school and again at bedtime. Therefore, only prescribed medication, which needs to be taken four times a day, can be administered in school.

All medication must be handed in to the school office in its original packaging and must be clearly labelled. A medication form will also have to be filled in by a person with parental responsibilty. If your child requires an un-prescribed medication, you will need to come into school to administer this. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.
