Key Questions

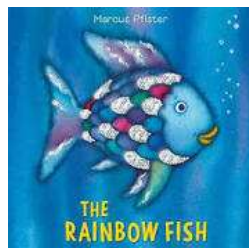
1. How can we be a good friend?

PSED

Children will be supported in settling into their daily school routines, helping to develop their independence and confidence. They will begin to form new friendships and will be encouraged to share their experiences with both adults and their peers. Staff will focus on getting to know each child and fostering strong, positive relationships.

P.E

The children will work with our sports coach Mr Atkinson and will learn how to balance and control their bodies. They will use apparatus such as mats, beanbags and hoops.



Expressive Arts and Design

The craft area will be set up with materials to encourage the children make their very own homes. They will learn new nursery rhymes and simple songs. The children will begin to mix different paint colours.

Communication and Language

The learning areas within the classroom will be designed to encourage the children to talk with one another, ask questions and share their ideas. Teaching staff will model and introduce new vocabulary to support the children's language development. During the Where I Live topic, the children will be encouraged to talk about their homes, families and local community, helping them to develop their confidence and communication skills.

Maths

Children will learn to represent and compare the numbers 1, 2 and 3. They will develop their understanding of matching and sorting objects, as well as comparing different quantities, while extending their mathematical vocabulary. The children will also learn number songs and nursery rhymes to support their mathematical development and understanding of early number concepts.

Literacy

We will be reading 'This is our house', 'The Rainbow Fish' and 'Martha Maps it out' The children will learn new vocabulary whilst exploring the stories and the knowledge extracted from the text.

Children will follow the Monster Phonics programme and will begin to bring home a Phonics reading book linked to the programme.
