
Parent Map Foundation Stage

Key Questions

- 1. What is Science?

Maths

In maths we will work on learning numbers to 10, using the language of combining two numbers.

We will be looking at length and height as well as beginning to sequence events in time order.

We will begin to recall doubles to 5.

PSED

We will focus on Healthy Me in our PSHE Jigsaw. The children will learn about how to stay healthy and the importance of sleep, brushing our teeth and exercise.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will build in a rocket.

They will learn how to listen and respond to a wide variety of music.

The children will continue to make observational drawings and will create vegetable soup and fruit smoothies in DT.

Literacy

We will be reading the book The Way Back Home. Children will learn new vocabulary whilst exploring the story and retelling this in detail. We will also be focusing on the story of Supertato and retell parts of it.

Children will begin to bring home a reading book that links with the phonics programme Monster Phonics. They will be required to say the sound of the graphemes they have learnt.
