Communication and Language

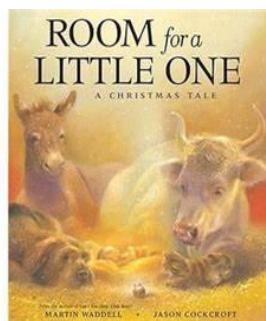

Maths

The children will be representing and comparing numbers 4 and 5. They will be matching and sorting items and comparing different shapes and describing some of their properties using Mathematical language. The children will continue to learn number songs and nursery rhymes to support their learning in Maths.

PSED

The children we be settling back into the daily school routine to build their independence up. They will be developing their confidence when talking about their own personal experiences with adults and peers.

Expressive Arts and Design

The creation station will be set up with materials to encourage children to make their own models. They will be taught fixing and cutting techniques. They will continue to learn colour mixing techniques and work with other media such as clay.

Literacy

As a class, we will be reading Ava's Poppy and Room for a Little One. The children will learn new vocabulary whilst exploring the stories and the knowledge extracted from the text.

The children will continue to follow the Monster Phonics Programme. They will be learning qu ch, sh, ng, th, ar, oo and be able to read and write words using these sounds.
