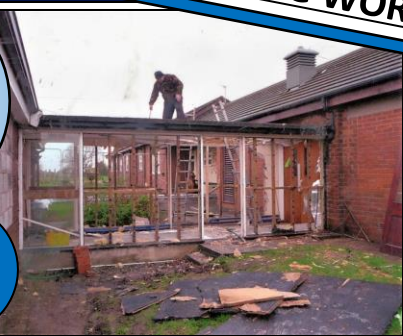
A newspaper article at the time reported:

# & MORE BUILDING WORKS!



Mrs Porter (Headteacher) and Mr Kings (Chair of Governors) managed significant alterations to modernise the building. The 'temporary' corridor linking Upper and Lower School was finally replaced after around thirty years. This was combined with the remodelling of the Head Teacher's office and the Staff Room.

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**A time of great change for school governors:**  
Increased responsibility was placed on their shoulders. Mr Kings the Chair of Governors, along with Mr Cookson the Chair of Buildings Committee, and Mr Pike the Chair of Finance and Staffing, worked tirelessly to manage the many projects to improve the school.

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## Under Threat?

During the early part of this decade small schools, such as Inskip, were under threat of closure. Both Mr Kings and Canon Peter Ballard (Diocesan Director of Education) went to great lengths to keep the school open.

Section 48 of the **Education Act 2005** directed the governing bodies of schools in England having a religious character, to secure that any denominational education given to pupils and the content of the school's collective worship are regularly inspected.

In 2001 Lord Dearing's Church Schools Review Group issued a report entitled 'The Way Ahead: Church of England Schools in the New Millennium.' It stated that church schools must be 'distinctively and recognisably Christian institutions'.

The Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS). The principal objective of SIAMS inspection is to evaluate how well the distinctive Christian character and ethos of the school ensure the development and achievement of the whole child.
