COVID-19

Due to rising cases of Covid within school we ask that if your child if feeling unwell with any of the symptoms that your child takes a lateral flow test before coming back into school.

Symptoms are

- A high temperature—this means you feel hot to the touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- A new, continuous cough—this means coughing a lot more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste—this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child shows any of these symptoms at school we will ring you immediately and expect you to come and collect your child.

Pupils who have a positive LFD test are required to self isolate for 10 days. Individuals who have **tested negative on day 5 & 6** of their self-isolation period and **do not have a temperature** will be permitted to end their isolation and return to school on day 6.

Pupils with a positive LFD test are required to isolate as above but are **not required** to take a confirmatory PCR test.

New Club—Forest School

We are looking forward to Mrs Nash starting a Forest School after school club in the grounds of Inskip St Peter's Primary School, to run on a **Monday evening from 3.30pm to 4.30pm**. Sessions will start from February 21st 2022 (the first week back after half term) and cost £6 per session. In order to plan sessions and develop the children's skills and experiences fully, sessions would need to be booked in half term blocks.



What is Forest School?

Forest School is an inspirational learning experience for your child. It supports play, exploration and supported risk-taking in an enriching outdoor environment. Child led play and discovery are the foundation of all our sessions. Children explore their surroundings, learn from them and use their imaginations as well as developing practical skills, such as fire lighting, food preparation and campfire cooking, lashings and knots, tool use, den building, natural arts and crafts. Your children will learn about and connect with the natural world by identifying flora and fauna, whilst learning about, respecting and nurturing our environment. We play team games, sing and tell stories, all of which develop their communication and collaboration skills.

What are the benefits of Forest School?

Forest School has so many benefits for its participants. Your children will be physically active for most of the session, building physical stamina as the sessions progress. As they tackle new challenges their confidence, self-esteem and resilience will grow which impacts their emotional and mental wellbeing. Children develop their team working skills in some of the sessions and learn to work independently in others. Forest School can be particularly effective for children who struggle in the classroom environment. Your children will learn to solve problems and be creative and imaginative at Forest School, showing enterprising behaviour.

Places are limited to 15 children, which are now taken. Please let us know if you would like your child to be added to the waiting list.
