Spring Term 2022 Reception Topics: Explorers and The Farm Shop

Communication and Language: Children will be taking part in the Nuffield Early Language Intervention programme. Talk time. Storytelling through role play begin to use more complex sentences.	PSED: Our learning for the first half of term is 'Health and Wellbeing' and we will be exploring 'What makes us healthy?'. During the second half of term our theme is 'Living in the wider world' and we will be thinking about the question 'What can we do with money?'
Physical Development: Scissor skills, finger gym activities, moving in the outdoors. In PE lessons they will develop fundamental movement skills through the topic 'Castles' then the topic 'Space'. Then in the second half of term Fundamental movement skills through the topic 'Hungry Caterpillar' and 'Rosie's Walk'	Literacy: Oral storytelling, labelling, story maps, caption writing, letter formation. In phonics we will be learning the sounds and high frequency words in Phase 3.
Mathematics: Continuing the NCETM Mastering Number programme. Learning through White Rose Maths topics 'Alive in 5!' introducing zero, comparing numbers to 5, composition of 4 & 5. In the second half of term beginning the topic 'Growing 6,7,8' numbers 6,7 & 8, making pairs and combining 2 groups.	Understanding The World: Ideas for learning/lines of enquiry will be led by the children's interests sparked by the themes of Explorers and The Farm Shop.

RE:

Our learning for the first half term our RE theme is 'Jesus as a Friend' and exploring the question 'Was it always easy for Jesus to show us friendship?'.
