



This half term is a great opportunity to revisit prior language learning of body part nouns, animal nouns and rules about nouns that the children have been introduced to already. Also, colour nouns will be recapped and the knowledge of adjectives, and the rules used with adjectives and nouns together will be extended.

Through songs, games and independent tasks, In this sequence of lessons, you will explore the following content, topics and language:

- Body part nouns and feeling unwell role play
- Revisit colours
- Learn singular nouns for jungle animals
- Use familiar and unfamiliar adjectives to describe animals
- Follow and understand a simple story
- Sequence and join in with retelling a story
- Write simple sentences in Spanish, using nouns, adjectives and the conjunction 'and'.

Learning Objective for each lesson:

- 1) remember parts of body and explain why I don't feel well/what hurts.
- 2) take part in a role-play dialogue about being at the doctor's.
- 3) understand and name jungle animals in Spanish.
- 4) understand adjectives to describe jungle animals in a story.
- 5) write a sentence using a noun, a verb and adjectives to describe animals.
- 6) write my own jungle explorer's story.



Adjectives agree with the noun they describe. The spelling of the same adjective can change if you are describing a masculine (el) noun or a feminine (la) noun.
