Reports.

Your child's annual report is now ready for you to collect. You will have received an email asking you to pick it up on Monday with a specific time. Please do arrive at the specified time and follow our safer distancing guidelines by waiting two metres apart. If your child is currently in school, the report will be sent home with them at the end of Monday. Within the report, you will find a letter from your child's new class teacher telling them which class they are in and asking them to carry out a summer task. If you would like to discuss the report further, please email the office to arrange a mutually convenient telephone conversation with your child's current teacher.

Transition Meetings:

We are planning to hold socially distanced transition meetings with your child's new class teacher at the end of term. You will be given a 15 minute time slot to attend and meet your child's new teacher. These will be held outside on the field and our usual social distancing rules will apply but please be aware if it rains, these meetings will be held via Teams. Further details about these meetings will be sent out next week.

Pick up and Drop Off

Thank you to all of the parents for following our social distancing measures, particularly waiting two metres apart. However, some parents have begun lingering at the beginning and end of the day to talk to other parents and friends. Whilst I understand after Lockdown it is lovely to catch up with friends, for safety reasons, I must ask you to leave the school site as soon as you have picked up your child, including from the square at the front of the school. Thank you for your understanding with this.
