Home learning has continued this week for the vast majority of our children mainly through the use of Purple Mash and White Rose Maths. The teachers have planned and organised a variety of differing activities for the children in the different year groups. In Reception, the children enjoyed focusing on the book *Rosie's Walk* and *Where, oh where, is Rosie's chick?* by Pat Hutchins. Whereas in Year 3, they have learnt about why we have skeletons and took a tour of the Nile. In Year 1, the children have looked at the world map and identified the 7 different continents and Year 4 have thought about healthy eating. Year 2 focused on common exception words whilst Year 5 revised the different parts of the flower. Plus there were lots and lots more learning for each year group...
