School Gates

As a result of the Parent Council meeting on Friday, the school staff have tightened up safeguarding arrangements for the gates. This means that the gates will close at 8:35 and 3:10. The school day officially starts at 8:30 so anyone arriving after this time is actually deemed as late. There seems to have been some confusion with regards to the start time but Mrs Coates has investigated this and it appears that the school day has always been 8:30 – 3:00. <u>Attendance</u>

Mrs. Coates will be doing an attendance check next week. This will involve looking at the children's attendance rates since September. Please be aware that the target for attendance is at least 96% and should your child's attendance drop below this, we may need to investigate why this is and whether there is any support we can offer you. We understand that some children have had illness and medical appointments which will be taken into consideration when we look at the figures.

Don't be alarmed or worried if we contact you regarding attendance; we want to help and make sure that your child has all the support possible to achieve their potential.

National Literacy Trust

As mentioned previously this year we are taking part in the National Literacy Trust's survey of children and young people to explore their views on reading, writing and listening.

Your child's participation is optional, but will provide valuable information for the National Literacy Trust and our school. The survey can be accessed via the links below. There is one survey for children aged 5-8 and one for children aged 9 and over. The survey for pupils aged 9 to 18 also includes a few questions on news literacy, diversity and empathy so could take up to 25 minutes to complete.

Children should try to answer the questions in this survey independently. However, they may need help to read and/or understand some of the questions.

As a school we will not be able to access individual pupils' results. However, we will receive a whole school report.

PE Update

Miss. Falconer (PE Leader) is currently investigating swimming lessons for the Year 5s when they enter Year 6. She is also going to investigate the Daily Mile initiative to see how we could implement this into our school day.

Bikeability is also an initiative that has been booked for the current Year 5s but in future will be offered to Year 5/6s. It is a cycling proficiency course that helps children to be safe on the roads but also ensure the cycles are maintained well. This will happen in the summer term.

Ely Museum Visits

This week, Year 3 and Year 4 were very lucky to have Lyndsey and Paul from Ely Museum deliver a workshop about the Stone Age. The children enjoyed handling some artefacts and replica items, as well as finding out how these would have been used. We looked at examples of weapons they would have used and how these have evolved over the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages. The children also did some carving into deer antlers, which gave them a real insight into how difficult and time consuming it must have been.
