Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a pupil's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are able to perform in exams and formal assessments. School absence due to a family holiday is not acceptable reason for absence and is always unauthorised. Many of you are not concerned about receiving a penalty notice, which is increasing to £80 per child, per parent, shortly but the absence then leads to gaps in your child's learning which can lead to upset and anxiety. If you receive three penalty notices within three years, the next course of action will be a prosecution. School is closed for 13 weeks of the year, please enjoy your family holidays during one of these times.
