Spotlight on behaviour:

Recently, we have been aware that there has been some talk of punishments and of punitive whole class measures happening. However, our behaviour policy is therapeutic and we don't talk about punishments. If a rule is broken, educational and protective consequences are put in place that relate to the incident, e.g. if the whole class are talking when walking to assembly, the class will practice. If a child is throwing rubbish, they will be asked to do a litter pick and if a child has not been listening during a lesson, the lesson will be repeated in their own time. Following the consequence, there is then a restorative conversation so that the child learns from their behaviour and makes the necessary changes. We then record the conversation on a behaviour log to track any incidents of behaviour. However, behaviour in school is very good, the rules are followed the majority of the time and the consequences and restorative consequences are rare.

Online Safety:

Christmas is such a wonderful time of year, excitable children and time to relax with family and friends. And of course, there are new toys to play with.

With a huge increase in sales of devices (around 13 million people receive smartphones for Christmas each year) it is important to ensure that you and your children are safe when playing with new kit.
