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What we've done this week...

Little Elvers: This week the little Elvers have been learning about themselves and what makes us different. We have explored different types of families and drawing our own framed family pictures. We have also been discussing what makes us special - exploring our different interests and expressing them through mark making.

Reception: This week we have been working on the Golden Rule, 'We work hard'. The children have been working really hard and enjoying going up the rainbow. In literacy this week we have been using our 'frog fingers' to say each phoneme in a word. In maths we have been measuring each other, our shoes and objects around the class. Thinking about the mathematical language. Big, medium and small. At the end of the day if your child has forgotten an item and needs to come back into the classroom can they please wait until all children have been dismissed.

Year One: This week in Year 1 we have begun our learning journey through exploring captions and lists. Additionally, we began to represent numbers in different ways and completed missing number problems. We really enjoyed our trip to Ely Museum and the children had a great understanding of old and new toys. They were exceptionally engaged and walked fantastically.

Please remember next week we will be having our teddy bear picnic on Thursday afternoon.

Year Two: What a fabulous year 2 trip to Framlingham castle. We enjoyed exploring the castle from the castle wall and walking around the outside of the castle. We even saw a secret Harry Potter door! Miss Lewis and Mrs Bates let us climb the hills and slide and roll down them. It was lots of fun. We have started recounting our trip and next week we will start learning how to write a letter of thanks.

Please remember children MUST have their reading books and reading logs in school EVERYDAY, as they will be reading them in class on a daily basis. Also when an adult reads with a child at home please write a comment in the log. Your children love this!!

Year Three: Wasp and Earwig classes have made a fantastic start to their new English topic learning the story of Nail Soup. Can they tell you the story, with actions? They have also been practicing counting in 1's, 2's, 10's and 100's to support their work on place value. In Theme, Year 3 have started to consider the Big Question: Was Hereward the Wake a hero or a Villain? They have been learning about the time Hereward lived and what Ely and the Fens were like in 1070.

Year Four: This week, Year 4 have begun learning their new Talk4Writing text, 'Sulius', they have created story maps and actions to help them remember the story and have looked in detail at new words they have come across – which they looked up the definitions of in the dictionary. In Maths, we have been looking at Place Value and have ordered and compared numbers. For History, we have started learning about Hereward the Wake and why he was important in local history.

Year Five: This week in year 5, we started our topics for maths and English for the next few weeks; place value and traditional story writing. We're practising using our new exercise books and the presentation so far has been amazing, good work year 5! We also looked at emotions around starting somewhere new and how we would help a new individual at our school. Our theme this week is Art and we are creating a picture of the Sutton Hoo helmet and we will be going into Saxon Jewellery over the next few days.
