Head Teacher's Comment – from Bryony Surtees

Welcome back, I hope you all had a lovely half term break and managed to relax and enjoy yourselves even though the weather was against us. Yesterday, the national guidance around COVID changed and there is no longer a need to self-isolate if you test positive although the advice is to stay at home. The DfE guidance for schools is slightly different and it states that children and young people with COVID should not attend school whilst they are infectious and should take lateral flow tests on day 5 and day 6. If both bests are negative, they should return to school as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. Therefore, if your child has a high temperature or a new continuous cough, we will still urge you to get your child tested with a PCR and to keep your child at home for five days, if they test positive. From 1st April, the Government will update the steps that anyone with COVID should take to minimise contact with other people. We expect further guidance on how to deal with suspected COVID, but in the meantime the local authority recommends that children affected should isolate at home for five days. If you child is isolating due to testing positive but you feel they are well enough to continue learning, the teachers will upload work for them onto TEAMs so please let us know. COVID infection rates in Cambridgeshire are still high and so we will continue to update you of any positive cases in your child's class. I wish you all a fabulous weekend.

Driving:

As you are probably aware the high way code has changed recently.

- When people are crossing or waiting to cross at a junction, other traffic should give way
- if people have started crossing and traffic wants to turn into the road, the people crossing have priority and the traffic should give way
- people driving, riding a motorcycle or cycling must give way to people on a zebra crossing and people walking and cycling on a parallel crossing

A parallel crossing is similar to a zebra crossing, but includes a cycle route alongside the black and white stripes.

This is important to remember when leaving or entering School Road. Pedestrians have right of way so please be mindful of this at pick up and drop off times.
