Share Sessions:

Next week, we are looking forward to holding our first parent share sessions for over two years. We would like to invite you into school to join your child for a writing lesson from 0830 – 0900. Key Stage 2 session is on Monday, Key Stage 1 session is on Tuesday and Early Years session will take place on Wednesday all at the same time. Please drop your child off as usual and then come to the office and sign in and you will be taken to your child's classroom.

One way system:

Even though COVID restrictions are no longer needed, we are still keeping our one way system when entering and leaving the school grounds. This allows for the flow of people to keep moving as everyone is going in the same direction. I am aware this is not popular with everyone as if you park in our car park, you then need to walk all the way around, especially if you have a child in reception, but I do ask that you respect our wishes and do not try and nip through gates or go against the flow of people.

COVID:

From the 1st April 2022, Covid-19 is managed in a similar way to any other respiratory illness. The similarities between the profile of Covid-19 and other respiratory viruses' means that individuals will be unable to distinguish one virus from another based on symptoms alone. The NHS have been updated their COVID-19 symptoms in adults and symptoms in <u>children guidance</u>. Children and young people who are unwell with these symptoms and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can come back to school and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. Most children who are unwell will recover in a few days with rest and plenty of fluids. If your child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or mild cough, and they feel well enough, they can go to school, college or childcare.

Attendance:

Attendance is once again mandatory at school and therefore, we expect you to send your child to school unless they have a high temperature, have an upset stomach or are so unwell, they cannot attend school. The government expects the children's attendance to be at least 97% and the teachers may be speaking to parents whose child's attendance is lower than this. Any absence due to holidays or birthdays will be unauthorised and following three of these, you may be at risk of a penalty notice being issued.



School uniform:

I would like to draw your attention to expectations regarding school uniform. Please ensure your child has the correct uniform when coming to school. This includes PE and forest school kit. If you wish to have the school logo on the uniform it can be purchased via the website (yourschooluniform.com). Non-logo uniform can be purchased at large supermarkets and stores.

Nail varnish and make up are not allowed. Watches and ear studs are allowed, but no other jewellery, including charity bands, for health and safety reasons. On PE days earrings should be removed.

EY/KS1: Plain white or white with school logo

No denim

Burgundy or blue and white check (not red)

Socks and tights

Plain burgundy, grey or black

No leggings

<u>Shoes</u>

Sensible shoes/trainers which will support your child's feet outside and inside. No strappy sandals or open backed sandals.

Dark blue or black. No bright colours or flashing lights.

PE and forest school kit

Plain colours only, no logos other than the school logo, no football shirts.

<u>T-shirt/ polo shirt</u> White

Sweat shirt/ hoodie

Burgundy (both items can be purchased via the website with the school's logo)

Shorts (inside and outside) and jogging bottoms (outside if cold)

Black

No leggings

Leotards (For gymnastics only)

Burgundy or black

Foot wear

Trainers or pumps which must be in addition to school shoes.

Forest school

Wellies, warm clothing, waterproof coats
