I now await to hear from the Trust board whether they give us permission to open on 1st June as well as waiting for the Government's announcement later next week. For those parents who will be sending their child back to school, there will be further information about the reopening following the Government's announcement. Of course, we have been open to the key worker and vulnerable children since the beginning of Lockdown and we will obviously continue to support these children after half term.
