The Government announced this week that all children will be back to school in September but we are awaiting further guidance from them about what this will look like and it is unclear what the reducing of the 2 metre to 1 metre plus social distancing means for our school. We will await the guidance with our usual patience and will work with the Trust and Local Authority to ensure that the safety and well-being of our pupils and staff is our main concern. # Keeping Children Safe Online:

The DfE has updated <u>guidance</u> for parents and carers about keeping children safe online. New information on apps has been added.

The BBC have a website and app called <u>Own It</u>. The website has a lot of content for children to help them navigate their online lives, and the free smartphone app comes with a special keyboard which can intervene with help and support in the moments that children need it the most.

<u>SafeToNet</u> is an app for parents to help them safeguard their children from online risks, like cyberbullying and sexting, whilst respecting their child's rights to privacy. The SafeToNet Foundation is providing UK families with free access to 1 million licences during coronavirus

### Arriving at School:

Thank you to all of the parents and children for following our socially distancing drop off and pick up arrangements – it is really working well. Please can we ask that those families who have younger children with them at these times keep your children by your side and do not allow them to run around, go in between other families or play with their friends?
