Spotlight on behaviour:

Behaviour in school is very good and the children are calm in the classes, they listen attentively and enjoy learning. They have good friendships and enjoy the playtime and socialising with our friends. However, they are children and are continually learning, including about behaviour and being kind and so we are having a big push on kindness at the moment, in thought, speech and deed. For the next few weeks, the head teacher's award will be given for kindness and the House Captains and the adults will be looking out for children carrying out random acts of kindness. Please talk to your child/ren about how they can be kind to each other and how this makes them and others feel. A simple smile might brighten up someone's day.

Online Safety:

Children regularly use different websites and apps, and it can be hard to keep up in this ever-changing digital world. But the things that help keep children safe online are often similar to the things that keep them safe offline. Talk about what they think is normal online and what behaviour to expect from others and from themselves. Encourage them to think critically and question what they see online. Talk to them about where they go to get information they trust, talk about fake news, fake followers and scams. Help them develop a healthy suspicion of whether people are who they say they are.



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Parking:

Several parents and residents have emailed into school recently with concerns regarding dangerous and inconsiderate parking at the beginning and end of the day. When you are dropping off or picking up, please be mindful of everyone. Cars parking opposite the school on School Road, causes a real blockage for traffic leaving our site and cars parking on the dropped kerb and over the double yellow lines is dangerous. The double yellow lines are there for a reason and no one should park on the pavements. Please be mindful and considerate of each other and the residents around the school whilst parking and remember that you are able to park in our car park, there is space.
