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Class news

<u>Little Elvers</u>: This week in Little Elvers we have begun to explore the topic of Winter. We have been exploring the scenery within this season -the changes that take place, what we can feel and see that is different. To go along with this we have created lots of snowflakes practicing scissor control, watercolour winter scene pictures and have also used large blocks of ice to mark make onto, describing the textures of the ice.

Reception: Bob our alien has had lots of fun helping us with real and alien words. We now need to help him get home! In literacy, we have recorded instructions for Bob to make jelly. In math, we have been recording and matching amounts. Our Big Question next week: "What did Bob see on his way home?". Each week the children are learning new tricky words. <u>Year 1:</u> We have been writing our innovated story, the children have written fantastically well ensuring they include 'ed' suffix words, WOW words, lots of description, beautiful handwriting and their phonics knowledge to spell. We have also begun to look at tens and ones and the importance of place value above 10. Investigating teen numbers and even larger ones. In theme we have explored Vincent Van Gogh looking at how he mark makes, please ensure your child has an art top in school to create their own starry night painting next week using acrylic. Best of all we have practiced our nativity and it is looking fabulous! Have a wonderful weekend!

Year 2: We all enjoyed planting our trees last Friday. Thank you to all the adults who shared this experience with us. This week we have made 'Tree Fairies' to place on the trees to keep them safe and to help them grow. Next Friday is our trip to the 'National Space Centre'. If you have not given permission or paid for this trip yet, contact the school office. All costumes for the play need to be in school on Monday in a clearly named bag. If you have any questions or queries about this please speak to Mrs Bates or Miss Lewis. Our dress rehearsal is on Thursday. The rest of the children in the school will watch it. On the inside cover of your child's reading log they have a login for 'Purple Mash', a website children can access at home to support their learning and development in ICT skills. Please help your child to logon and explore it. It was a pleasure to see you all at parents' evenings this week. It was a great opportunity for us all to celebrate your child's successes and things they need to develop.

<u>Year 3:</u> We have been learning how to add and subtract 3 digit numbers crossing tens and hundreds. We have continued to learn our new non-fiction text this week and the children have worked really hard to memorise the story. We have discussed direct and reported speech and power of three. In science, the children have continued to learn about how shadows are formed and have conducted an experiment using puppets to form their own shadows. Homework books are due back on Wednesdays, ready to be sent home again on Thursdays. Please ensure your child is also completing their 15 minutes a week on TT rockstars.

<u>Year 4:</u> Year 4 have had lots of interesting conversations about British values. We have thought about why the Rule of Law is important and taking responsibility for our actions. In our Maths lessons, we have been thinking about how we can use our times tables to solve problems and in English we have been writing poems about the trees we planted last Friday. We have also made artwork based around these trees.

<u>Year 5:</u> This week, Year 5 have been reflecting on last week's tree planting as well as our current affairs with democracy. We have been forming our own parties and writing manifestos for people to support. They have engaged eagerly in these activities and have stood for some great things. In English we have consolidated our debating skills by writing persuasively about issues that affect our school. In Maths, we have gone into detail about multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 and how we use easy step by step methods to solve problems.
