What we've done this week...

Little Elvers: This week Little Elvers have been exploring the topic 'birthdays'. We decorated balloon pictures and made our own birthday cakes using a variety of messy play tools - using them to roll and mix before adding candles to the finishing product. Then we had our very own party which we created brightly coloured invites for and played a game of pass the parcel.

Reception: The children have been enjoying their new challenges this week both inside and out. In literacy we have been using Fred Fingers. Fred is our new class pet; he helps us say our sounds correctly. The children are enjoying using letter join to help their pencil control and formation. You can visit the website at <u>www.letterjion.co.uk</u> and join as a parent. In maths we have been creating super heroes, using mathematical language to describe the shapes. The children have been very excited this week using white boards during their CLIC input. CLIC is a mathematical input we use to teach children mathematical skills. Thank you for all your support and encouragement. Have a wonderful weekend.

Year One: In Maths, we have been ordering objects as well as plotting numbers on a number line working within 10. In English, we have started our unit of work of Old Bear by using the Talk 4 Writing approach. The children have been looking at the use of capital letters, adjectives and conjunction and have had the opportunity to apply their knowledge. In Theme, the children have conducted a simple experiment by testing which material is more effective to protect a teddy bear from water. They then discussed their results from the experiment and explained their conclusion.

Year Two: STOP THE PRESS – DRAGON in Year 2 classes. This week both Year 2 classes were destroyed by a DRAGON!!! We found footprints on the floor and our furniture was turned over! We decided that we needed to think about how to trap the dragon. We have written instructions using time connectives, First, next, after that, then, finally. We came up with some brilliant ideas as to how we could capture the dragon. Mrs Bates and Miss Lewis were very impressed and thanked us for trying to stop the dragon from returning to the school.

Year Three: This week Year 3 class have been innovating their own versions of the Nail Soup story. We have been really impressed with the adjectives and adverbs the children are using to improve their sentences. In maths the children have been solving problems using place value and can now find 1, 10 or 100 more or less than any three digit number. They have moved onto our Science Big Question: How can a villain make their getaway faster? To answer this question we have started to investigate forces, friction and magnets

Year Four: This week, Year 4 have started their new science topic on forces and magnets. They thought about what forces they already knew about and when we use push/pull forces, before investigating how materials affect forces impacting a toy car. In Maths, we have been looking at rounding to the nearest 10 and 100. We have thought carefully about which digit to look at to work out if we need to round up or down and children made their own number lines to show whether numbers need to be rounded up or down. In English, we have thought about how to build tension in stories and how to create an effective setting description. We are now moving on to creating class innovations of our text 'Sulius'.

Year Five: This week, children have been learning how to round numbers and write up their own versions of 'Axe Soup'. We have been looking at lots of different literary tools and including these in our work. In the afternoons, we have been learning about Properties of Materials for Science and about the importance of music in our lives. We are trying to encourage everyone to walk to school for Walk to School Month too. Finally, Friday is our school Trip to West Stow – we are all very excited!
