Context	In March 2020, the nation went into a lockdown period due to a pandemic. This meant that a significant proportion of children did not have access to a formal education throughout the summer term. Children at Isle of Ely Primary School were offered online and offline learning opportunities but the uptake of this was variable. Therefore, the catch up funding offers an opportunity to support additional work within school.
