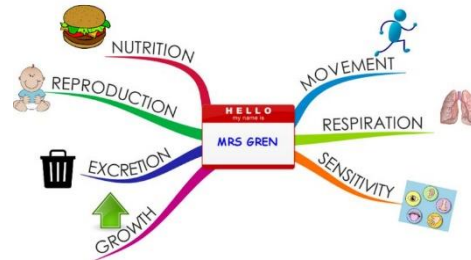











Key Vocabulary	Definition

Cold-blooded and use gills to breathe underwater.
